Frank March is a Senior Specialist Advisor in the Digital Development Group of the Ministry of Economic Development (MED), Wellington, New Zealand. The group is responsible to the Minister for Communications and Information Technology for developing and coordinating work on a range of New Zealand's digital development issues.

For many years he has been involved with developing Internet policy and advising on a wide range of technical and other Internet-related issues. He is the New Zealand delegate to the ICANN Governmental Advisory Committee. He has worked extensively on broadband development strategies for New Zealand, in particular community-based or partnered open access urban fibre networks and rural broadband initiatives.

In 2005 he was a member of the Secretariat of the Working Group on Internet Governance, on leave from the MED. In a private capacity, he is vice-president of Internet New Zealand, which is a private non-profit body responsible, *inter alia*, for management of the .nz top-level domain.

He has a BSc(Hons) and PhD in chemistry from the University of Canterbury, Christchurch.
