# BACKGROUND

- The African advanced level Telecommunications institute (AFRALTI) is an Intergovernmental institution that started as an UNDP funded project executed by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) in 1987.
- The mandate of AFRALTI was to develop and conduct advanced level telecommunication training for English speaking countries in East and Southern Africa.
- Its mandate remains the development of human capacity building in the area of ICT.



## AFRALTI's' ROLE

- AFRALTI and its partners in particular the ITU has continued to provide capacity building programs successfully for the region in the various target markets.
- Since inception ,AFRALTI has trained over 5000 personnel for the ICT sector in Africa.
- AFRALTI has conducted over 300 training courses in the last 5 years.
- Courses have been delivered in more than 15 countries, including the Netherlands and Iran.



# THE NEED FOR CAPACITY BUILDING

- The greatest challenge facing players in the ICT market remains the need to keep up with the pace of change in a dynamic industry.
- Some of the drivers of change in the ICT industry include technology change, competition, globalization and changing consumer needs .
- Hence they need to acquire new knowledge almost real time so as to meet the challenges and remain viable in a market that changes so fast.
