

Mobile Termination Rates and its impact on retail rates in the ECTEL Member States

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Preamble

- In March of 2009, ECTEL made a recommendation to the National Telecommunications Regulatory Commissions (NTRCs) on cost-oriented interconnection rates in the ECTEL Member States.
- ECTEL proposed that an adjustment be made to the Mobile Termination Rates charged to providers on the islands.
- >A three-year plan for the reduction of the MTRs using a 'glide path' concept, commenced on April 1, 2009.
- The ECTEL recommendation resulted in setting cost-oriented termination rates (as is the case for fixed and mobile networks) and hoped to influence a downward shift in retail mobile to mobile on-net and off-net rates across the ECTEL MEMBER STATES.

ECTEL Region Facts (Pre-introduction of single MTR)

- MTRs differed based on call origination: calls originating from local mobile, local fixed and international networks attracted different termination rates. This is illustrated in the Figure I below.
- The average MTR for calls originating from an international network, a fixed network and a mobile network were U.S \$0.20, U.S \$ 0.22 and U.S \$0.20 respectively.

ECTEL Region Facts (Post-introduction of single MTR)

The average rate declined to U.S \$ 0.135 in 2009, U.S \$0.115 in 2010 and U.S \$ 0.09 in 2011. (See Figure 2)

- > One Mobile Termination Rate was put in place of the mobile termination rates for calls originating from an international network, fixed network and mobile network.
- The current average MTR among the ECTEL Member States stand at E.C \$ 0.251 (US \$0.093). The table in figure 3 below shows each Member State's current MTR and were each ranked in order of highest (1) to the lowest (6) rate.

ECTEL Region Facts (Post-introduction of single MTR)

The average MTR of the ECTEL Member States is seven percent higher than the average MTR of 17 other LAC studied. Table 4 shows the comparison of the averages of ECTEL Member States against these 17 LAC countries.



<u>Key</u>

Segment I (Low): $0.048 \le MTR \le 0.068$ Segment 2(medium): $0.074 \le MTR \le 0.094$ Segment 3(High): $0.095 \le MTR \le 0.156$

- MTRs declined from an average of U.S \$0.23 per minute by the end of 2009 to an average of U.S \$0.09 per minute by 2011, a 14 cents or 61 percent reduction in whole sale per minute rates over the three year period.
- As a result of the reduction in the MTRs in 2009, ECTEL was able to take further regulatory action in 2010 to reduce FTM retail rates across Member States.
- In Rule 12 of the current Price Cap Plan (PCP), Basket 6 establishes the maximum prices which LIME (the incumbent carrier) is able to charge for a FTM call. These maximum rates were outlined by ECTEL in the PCP which came into effect on April 15, 2010.
- Fixed to mobile (FTM) retail rates declined from U.S\$0.26 per minute to U.S \$0.15 per minute. A U.S \$0.11 or 42 per cent reduction in FTM per minute rates over the same period 2008-2011.

 FTM voice traffic activity has been declining at a slower rate since the reduction in FTM retail rates across the ECTEL Member States from 2009 through to 2011. (see figure 2)



- MTM rates in majority of the ECTEL Member States were generally not influenced by the reduction in MTRs on the islands.
 - MTM off-net rate trends in some ECTEL Member States remained unchanged despite the reduction in MTRs.
 - MTM on-net rate trends in some ECTEL Member States, already somewhat in line with MTRs, responded with small downward movements.



Summary of the ECTEL observation

- > MTR rates reduced in an effort to influence downward push on retail prices.
- FTM rates in the ECTEL Member States were influenced downward as a result of the MTR decline.
- > On average MTM rates generally not phased by changes in the MTR decline
- On average MTM off-net rates in the ECTEL Member States have not reacted to the change in MTRs and remained flat for the most part.
