

# Threat or opportunity?





- Takes Jamaican ISPs with VSATs to court considering it a breach of its exclusive international license.
- Plans to move all its customers and services onto the new IP network. "I think within four years all our customers' voice traffic will be carried over IP."






## The demise of international

Dial-up versus leased line cost for Internet access


