I have the pleasure to invite you to the **Harmonized Calculation Method (HCM) for Africa** workshop organized by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), under the aegis of the HIPSSA¹ project, and co-hosted by the African Telecommunications Union (ATU) from 29 to 31 October 2012 in Nairobi, Kenya.

The aim of this workshop is to present the result of the assessment conducted to date with your collaboration and to prepare a draft multilateral agreement including a harmonized calculation method characterized by transparency and accuracy which can be accepted by all the participating countries.

This workshop will give the relevant officials the opportunity to discuss the document as a group and consolidate all suggested changes for endorsement by all administrations.
