## MAIN RESULTS

The meeting examined three documents:

**Document 1/097:** Status and proposed workplan, was presented in detail by the Rapporteur.

**Document 1/072:** La radiodiffusion télévision rurale et communication pour les zones rurales isolées, presented by Mali, will be presented in detail during the meeting of Study Group 2, as it relates mainly to the rural question.

**Document 1/078:** Transducteur tactile-acoustique, was presented by the representative of A.U.L.M. (Switzerland).

There was then an intervention from Mr. Everton from New Zealand, connected to the meeting by a videoconferencing link. Mr. Everton, who was the originator of the Question in WTDC-98 (Malta), explained the situation of the Maori indigeneous population in his country.

## FUTURE WORK PLAN

The proposed plan for 1999 and 2000 is as follows:

- 1) 1999 Renew call for participation from members
- 2) 1999 Establish liaison with Question 10/2 and Task Force on Gender issues;

- 4) 2000 Produce the initial report and some reprensentative case studies.
