Context: Why Emphasize Capacity Building?




- Effective regulatory framework is key for promoting ICT for all
 - Effective regulatory framework key for making markets work
 - Impact on wider access, better prices and improved quality
 - → Lessons from experience
 - → WSIS, Geneva 2003-Tunis 2005
- Regulators and policy makers need adequate tools and skills to design, implement and update their regulatory environment
 - Critical element for successful sector reform
- Sector characterized by a high rate of innovation both with regards to technologies and business models
 - Constant need to update skills to stay in tune with the latest developments in the sector

Supply side: Wide range of capacity building programs dealing with ICT policy and regulatory issues








Demand side: Constant growing Demand

Widespread sentiment among regulators and policymakers that ongoing initiatives do not fully respond to their growing demand for capacity building



Outsourcing de facto solution to respond to urgent needs



Comprehensive Subject matter coverage:

- □ Based on toolkit
- □ Other issues as the need arises

□ Wide Audience reach

 Wide coverage of regulatory professionals including policy makers, heads of regulatory Authorities, staff of regulatory Authorities and the wider regulatory community

How best to respond to client needs?





- Different needs according to the Country level reform
 - Early reformer
 - Countries in the first generation reform
 - Newly established regulators
- Different needs According to individual profile
 - Regulator/policymaker/wider regulatory community
 - □ Board members/commissioners/professional staff
- Different needs according to legal tradition and language
 - □ Civil law/common law
 - Content developed in original language+ translation

How to respond to client need (2)



- Different outputs to respond to specific needs
 - Formal training
 - □ Peer-to-peer learning
 - Off the shelf training modules for self learning
- Need for a feedback loop from beneficiaries
 - A strategic steering committee comprised of selected regulators, regulatory associations and academic institutions to give high level advice and provide continuous evaluation

Options for sustainability



- Train the trainers?
 - **Identifying the trainers**
 - Members of regulatory associations
 - Nominated members of academic/training institutes
 - Others (ITU center of excellence,...)

How do we ensure quality training for the trainers? How to ensure the quality of the training they provide remains high?

- E-learning Tools?
 - Bringing the information closer to recipients
 - Low cost and effective tool
 - How do we ensure quality and interactivity?
 - What are the best options for e-learning?

Options for sustainability (2)




- Forging partnerships for effective delivery
