As you have requested, I am now formally submitting my thoughts and feedback on reviewing the draft documents posted on the ITU website. I believe that they are very comprehensive and convey a clear message to the reader.

However, I have a few comments on the **draft report on "The Source of Online Threats to Youth and Children"**

Points 1.5 and 1.6 in the section on 'overview of online threats'

This section may need to more explicitly mention the importance of considering the 'physical environment' and 'geographical locations' from where the child is engaging with the internet, within the context of a given country such as urban, rural, semi-urban etc. This is because our research indicates that these factors 'greatly impacts and influences the threats and risks' that the child will be exposed to.

Furthermore, I would like to make, a general observation in the 'context of policy integration and enforcement' but I'm not exactly sure in which document this comment belongs? From our discussions with many governments, it is apparent that as we move forward to a more 'operational and tactical role for COP' there is a great need to assist member countries on how to 'integrate, interlock and enforce' related policies across multiple sectors (the public, private and civil society). Particularly, between 'regulators and operators/services providers' and 'law enforcement agencies and civil society'

I have reflected on the content of our 82 page COP 'Guidelines for Policy Makers' but still feel that the level of detail required is missing.
