Participation/Visa requirements

<u>It is intended that delegate registration for the Study Group 7 block of meetings will be carried out exclusively online</u>. Each Member State/Sector Member/ Associate was requested to designate a Focal Point to be responsible for the handling of all registration requests belonging to his/her administration/organization. The username and ID number to access the online registration will be sent electronically on 15 August 2008. Online registration will commence on 1 September 2008.

I would like to remind you that citizens of some countries are required to obtain a visa in order to enter and spend time in Switzerland. The visa must be requested and obtained from the office (embassy or consulate) representing Switzerland in your country or, if there is no such office in your country, from the one that is closest to the country of departure. If problems are encountered, the Union can, at the official request of the administration or company you represent, approach the competent Swiss authorities in order to facilitate delivery of the visa. For delegates/participants who have made their request online via their respective Member State/Sector Member/ Associate DFP, the process for requesting visa support has been simplified. If ITU Headquarters' assistance is required, the request for support in obtaining a visa may be made by the DFP at the time of

completion of the registration request for the individual concerned. On the bottom of the registration form, the DFP will find several questions which must be completed fully and accurately. The required information is as follows:

Date of birth

Passport number

Passport issuance and expiry dates

The visa support procedure will subsequently follow automatically. The delegate/participant will be notified via the Confirmation of Registration form sent to his/her e-mail address that the visa support request has been received and is being processed.
