The conditions governing the approval of ITU-T Recommendations were met and 12 Member States participating in the last meeting of Study Group 8 approved the text of these Recommendations during the Plenary session held on 10 February 2000.

¹ The United States took the 4-week period for consideration (under Resolution 1, § 8.5.5) of their position for approval of Annex E contained in ITU-T Recommendation T.38 Amendment 2, since this Annex was dependant on the approval of draft ITU-T Recommendation H.248 by Study Group 16 at their February meeting.

Subsequently, Study Group 16 did not approve ITU-T Recommendation H.248 but rescheduled its approval at the next Study Group 16 meeting of 15 June 2000. The United States then informed the TSB Director that if ITU-T Recommendation H.248 is approved in June, the United States would not object to the approval of Annex E without any further need for formal action by Study Group 8.
