Approval and deletion of ITU-T Recommendations

A.1 By TSB Circular 274 of 25 May 2000 it was announced that the following new and revised ITU-T Recommendations were approved, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Resolution 1, Section 8, of the WTSC (Geneva, 1996):

- ITU-T Recommendation J.53: Sampling frequencies to be used for the digital transmission of studio-quality and high-quality sound-programme signals
- ITU-T Recommendation J.90: Electronic programme guides for delivery by digital cable television and similar methods – Reference operating scenario and requirements
- ITU-T Recommendation J.116: Interaction channel for local multipoint distribution systems
- ITU-T Recommendation J.118: Access systems for interactive services on SMATV/MATV networks
- ITU-T Recommendation J.120: Distribution of sound and television programs over the IP network
- ITU-T Recommendation J.142: Methods for the measurement of parameters in the transmission of digital cable television signals
- ITU-T Recommendation J.143: User requirements for objective perceptual video quality measurements in digital cable television
- ITU-T Recommendation J.180: User requirements for statistical multiplexing of several programmes on a transmission channel

The conditions governing the approval of ITU-T Recommendations were met and 10 Member States participating in the last meeting of Study Group 9 approved the text of these Recommendations during the Plenary session held on 18 May 2000.

A.2 By TSB Circular 279 of 26 June 2000, it was announced that the following new and revised ITU-T Recommendations were approved, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Resolution 1, Section 8, of the WTSC (Geneva, 1996):

- ITU-T Recommendation A.5: Generic procedures for including references to documents of other organizations in ITU-T Recommendations
- ITU-T Recommendation A.7: Focus Groups: Working methods and procedures

The conditions governing the approval of ITU-T Recommendations were met and 29 Member States participating in the last meeting of Telecommunication Standardization Advisory Group (TSAG) approved the text of these Recommendations during the Plenary session held on 14 June 2000.

B. By TSB Circular 275 of 5 June 2000, it was announced that the following ITU-T Recommendation was deleted, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Resolution 1, Section 8, of the WTSC (Geneva, 1996):

 ITU-T Recommendation K32 (05/95): Immunity requirements and test methods for electrostatic discharge to telecommunication equipment – Generic EMC Recommendation

The conditions governing the deletion of ITU-T Recommendations were met and 16 Member States participating in the last meeting of Study Group 5 proposed to delete the text of this Recommendation. Nine Administrations of Member States responded to the consultation on 2 June 2000, and no objection to the deletion was received.
