Study Groups restructuring

Many proposals, based on Question grouping

- 8 study groups maintained:
 2, 3, 5, 12, 13, 15, 16, 17
- 5 study group activities distributed:

$$\begin{array}{c} \succ \quad 4 \rightarrow 2, 15 \\ \hline \quad 6 \rightarrow 15 \\ \hline \quad 9 \rightarrow 16 \\ \hline \quad 11 \rightarrow 13 \\ \hline \quad 19 \end{array}$$



Creation of a new Focus Group on ICT and climate change:

FG ICT&CC

The Focus Group will identify from the standardization viewpoint, the impact of ICTs on climate change, in particular:

- > direct impact: reduction of ICT's own emissions over their entire lifecycle
- indirect impact: mitigation that follows through the adoption of ICTs in other relevant sectors
- Facilitating the monitoring of relevant climate parameters
- Deliverables within half of next year



Proposal for an ITU mark

- Conformance to ITU Recommendations
- Quality seal
- Confidence to the consumer
- Several ways:
 - self declaration
 - Neutral test laboratory to test equipement
 - Plus a green mark for conformance to environment requirements
- Many concerns, 2 other months opportunity to discuss



Recommendations and Resolutions preparation

- Resolutions give the frame of ITU-T work
- Resolution 1: Rules of procedures
- Resolution 2: Study Group structure and mandate
- Recommendation A.1: Working methods
- New proposed Recommendation A.SCC on seminars and workshops, proposal to make a Resolution of it.
