RECOMMENDATION 820

USE OF 9-DIGIT IDENTITIES FOR NARROW-BAND DIRECT-PRINTING TELEGRAPHY IN THE MARITIME MOBILE SERVICE

(Question 5/8)

The CCIR,

considering

a) that CCIR Recommendations 476 and 625 provide for the use of narrow-band direct-printing equipment;

b) that Recommendation 625 provides for the use of maritime mobile service identities (MMSI) in accordance with the provisions of Appendix 43 of the Radio Regulations (RR);

c) that only the use of 9-digit MMSI offers the improved procedures of Recommendation 625 for the establishment and re-establishment of radio circuits which will also reduce the possibility of a message being received at a wrong station;

d) that in order to maintain compatibility with older equipment built in conformance with Recommendation 476, the new equipment built in accordance with Recommendation 625 still needs a 5-digit identity in addition to the 9-digit MMSI (see also Recommendation 585),

recommends

1. that the use of 5-digit identities as specified in Appendix 44 to the RR be restricted to those situations where one or both stations use equipment conforming to Recommendation 476-4 (Düsseldorf, 1990);

2. that administrations, in accordance with Appendix 43 to the RR, assign 9-digit identities in addition to 5-digit identities, to all stations under their jurisdiction which are, or will be, fitted with equipment conforming to Recommendation 625;

3. that coast stations are fitted with, or converted to, ARQ equipment in conformity with Recommendation 625 as soon as possible.
