The working group has commended what has been achieved within the framework of the initiatives submitted to the last WTDC (United Arab Emirates, 2014) and adopted by the plenipotentiary conference that same year in Busan. The group further affirmed the importance of continuing the cooperation between ITU and the League of Arab States in several of these initiatives.

As regards the WTDC, we look forward to the usual inter-Arab coordination and fruitful cooperation between all the Arab States, as well as coordination with other regional groups, to enable the conference to produce outputs consistent with the needs and specific features of the Arab region, which will help develop the ICT sector for the benefit of the entire Arab nation.

Once more, I would like to thank the Republic of the Sudan and ITU for hosting and organizing this important event. May God crown our efforts on behalf of the Arab nation with success.
