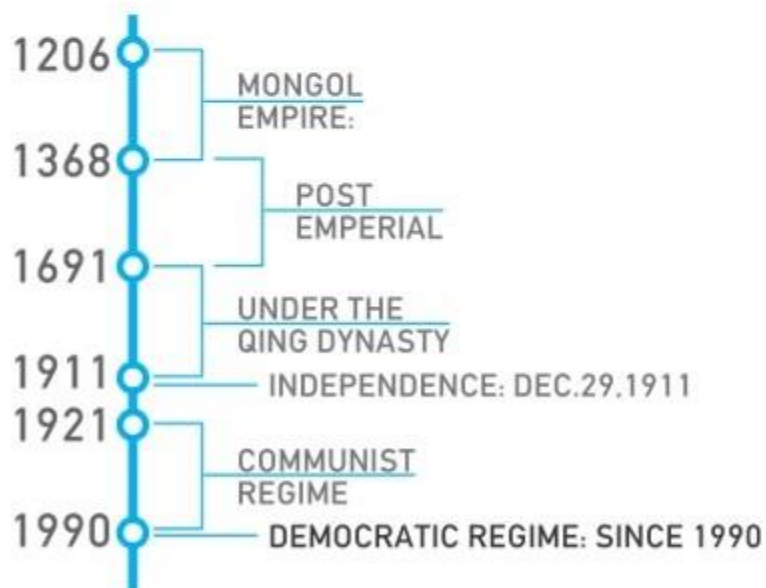

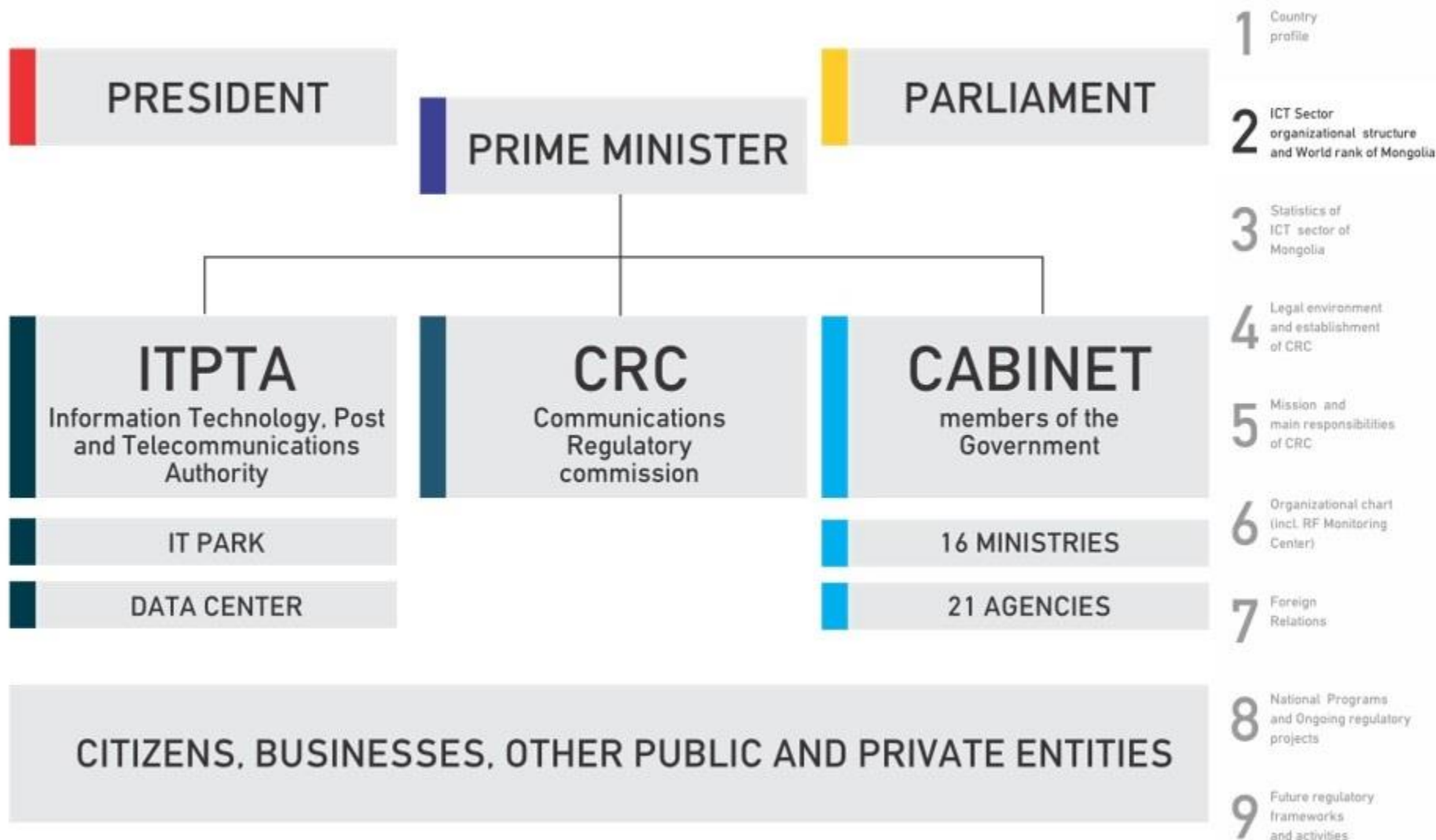

2. ICT SECTOR ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND WORLD RANK OF MONGOLIA

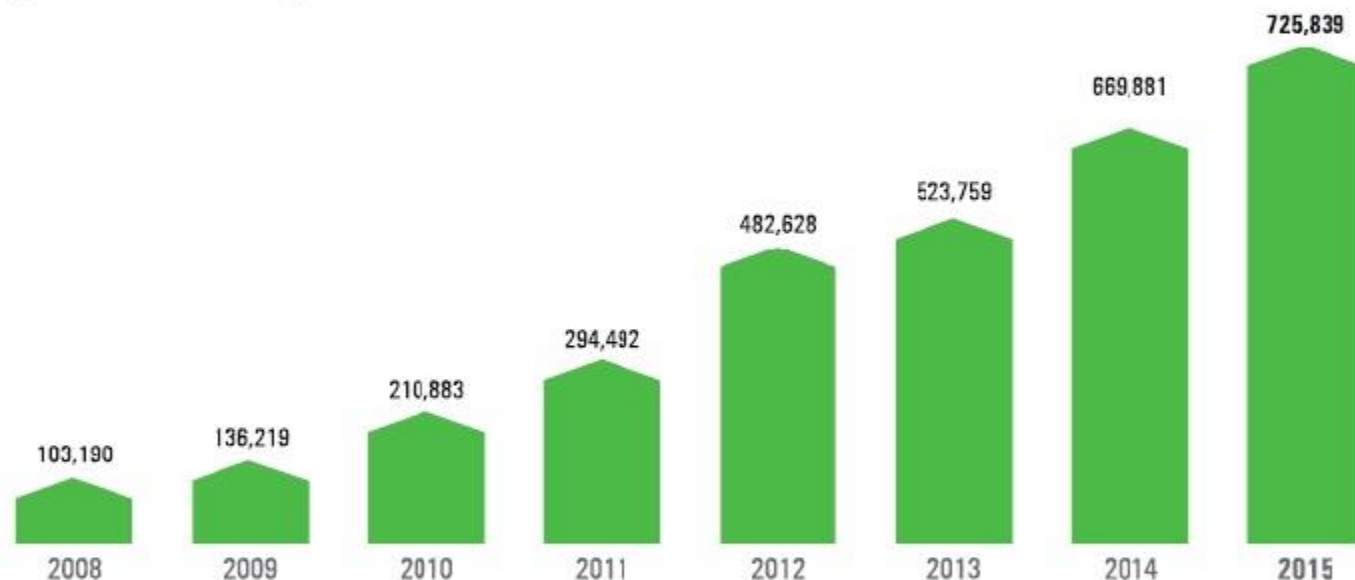

(Registered subscribers)



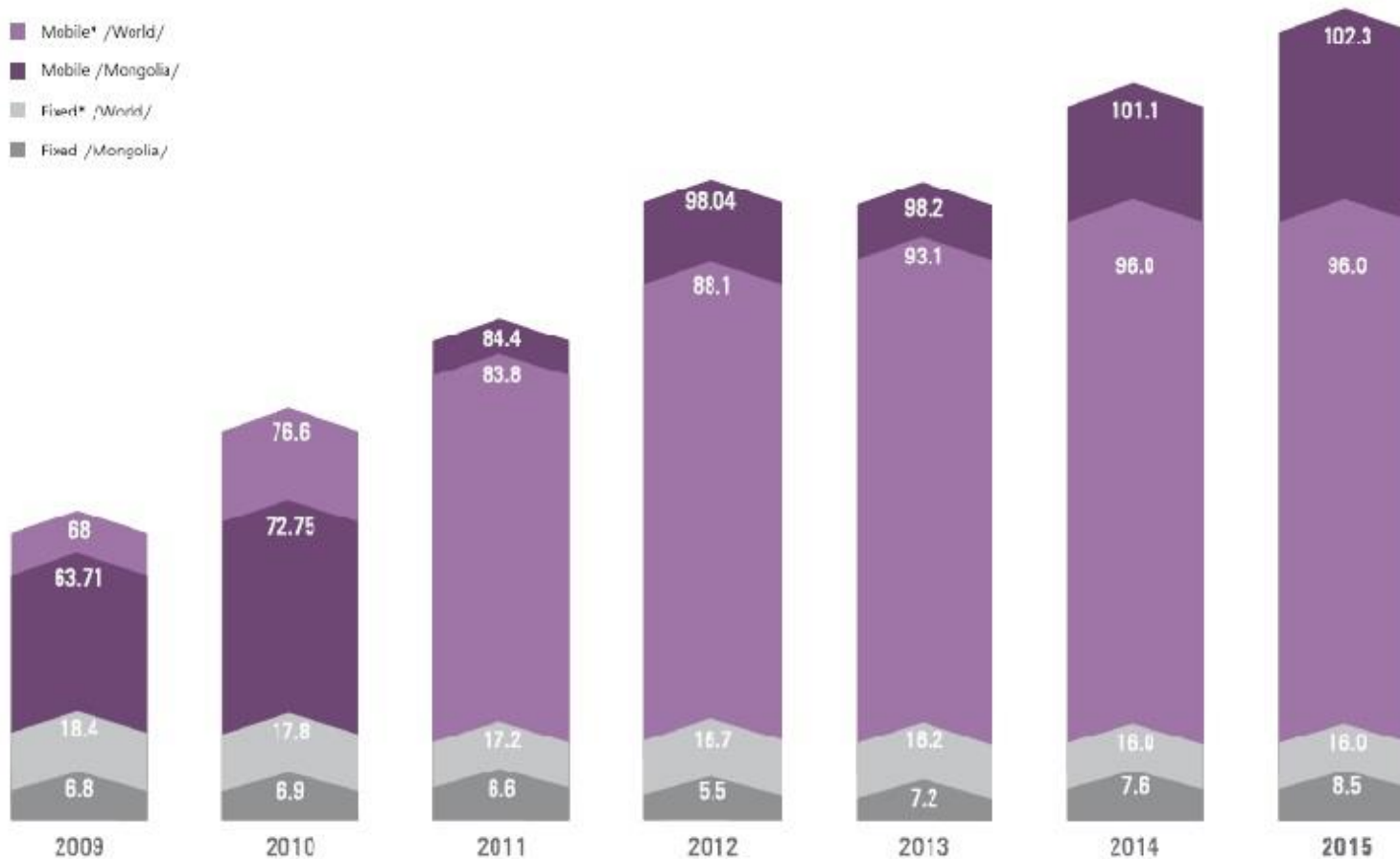

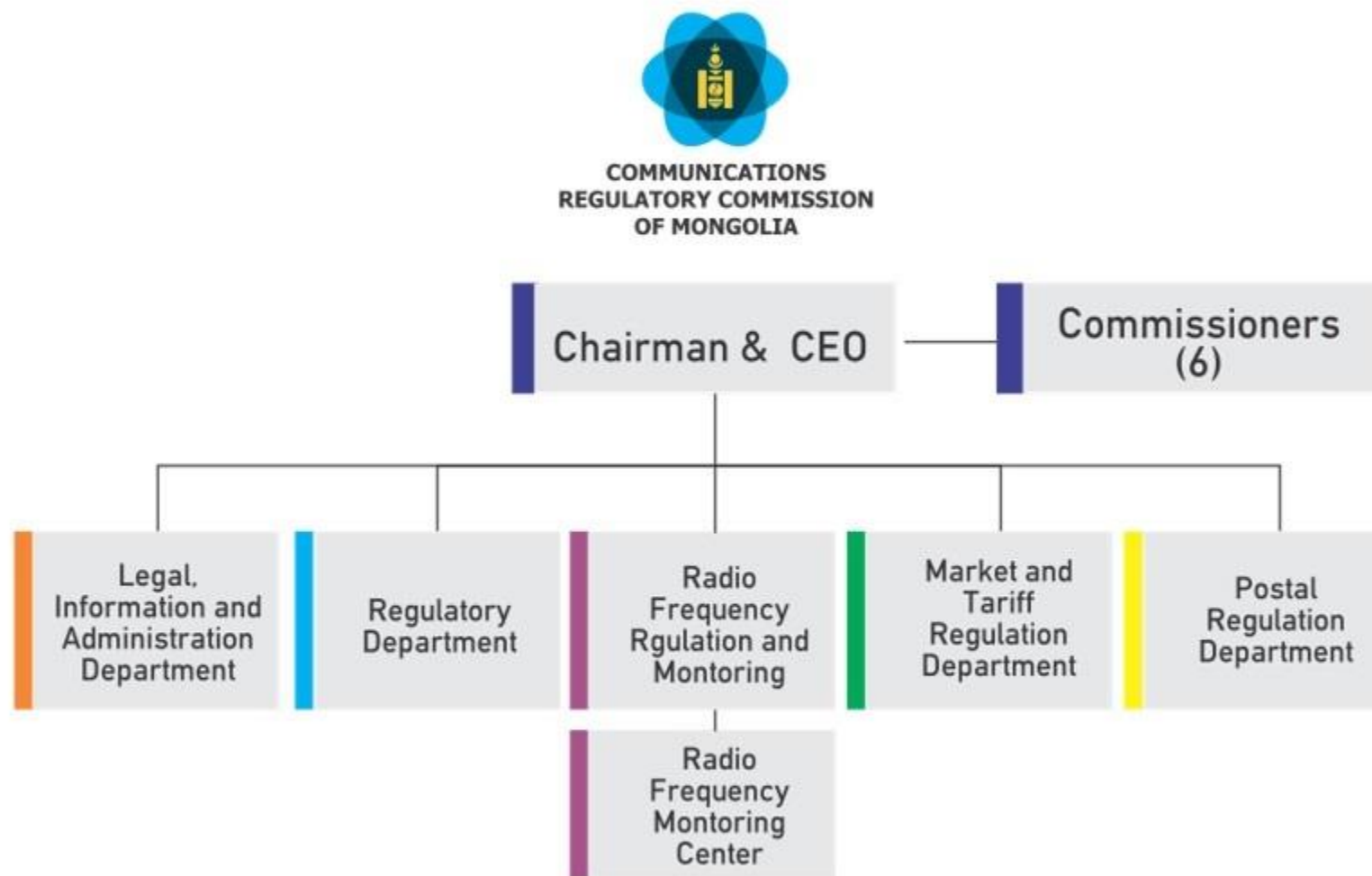
