By taxi:

CQT is located at Block S15, National University of Singapore (NUS), Science Drive 2 (off Lower Kent Ridge Road).

By train and bus services:

The nearest bus station to CQT is LT27 or S17.

You may take a MRT <u>train</u> to the Kent Ridge Station (CC24) on the Circle line. From the Kent Ridge Station, you can walk to CQT (<u>Walking instructions from google maps</u>) or take the campus shuttle buses service 'A1', 'BTC', 'D1' and alight at the second stop (LT27).

You may also take bus 95 to LT27 or S17.

NUS internal bus services:

The nearest bus station to CQT is LT27 or S17.

If you are in the NUS campus, you can take the Internal Bus Service 'A1', 'A2', 'D1', 'D2', 'K' to CQT. You can also take the NUS Bus Service 'BTC' at the Botanic garden MRT station to CQT. The internal bus services are free-of-charge and anyone can take the buses.

Parking:

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE IN SINGAPORE:

Passport and VISA:

All foreign visitors entering Singapore must have a valid passport.

Visitors from countries whose citizens require a visa should, at the earliest time and well in advance of travel, apply for a visa at a Singapore Embassy or consulate.

Delegates who require an introduction letter to apply for VISA are requested to fill the form in **Annex 2** and send it to the host country coordinators by email.

COVID-19 travel advisory for arrival, transiting and departure:

From 29 August 2022, all travellers can enjoy quarantine-free travel to Singapore with simplified COVID-19 measures in place.

A summary of the requirements **as of 5 October 2022** for entry with respect to COVID-19 are listed here. For up-to-date information on the requirements, please visit: https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart/entering-singapore.

Travellers born on or before 31 Dec 2009 may enter Singapore as per normal without testing or quarantine, only if they have taken the minimum WHO-EUL vaccine dosage listed below at least two weeks before arrival in Singapore, and can show proof of vaccination:

1. One dose of CanSinoBIO/Convidecia or Janssen/J&J vaccine; OR

- Two doses of AstraZeneca, Covaxin, Moderna/Spikevax, or Covishield vaccine administered at least 24 days apart; OR
- 3. Two doses of Novavax/Covovax/Nuvaxovid, Pfizer/BioNTech/COMIRNATY, or Sinopharm vaccine, administered at least 17 days apart; OR
- 4. Two doses of Sinovac vaccine, administered 13 days apart; OR
- 5. Mixture of any two doses of vaccines listed in points 1-4, administered at least 17 days apart; OR
- Any of the vaccination combinations listed in points 1-5 and subsequently recovered from COVID-19; OR
- 7. At least one dose of any WHO EUL approved vaccines listed in points 1-4, taken at least 28 days after a COVID-19 positive diagnosis

The following types of vaccination proof in English or translated to English are accepted if they contain personal identification details (e.g. name, date of birth, ID number) that match against the traveller's passport:

- Digital vaccination apps clearly indicating vaccination doses taken; or
- Hardcopy certificates clearly indicating vaccination doses taken; or
- Acceptance letter from the <u>Vaccination Check Portal</u> if you hold a <u>digital vaccination certificate</u> issued by countries/regions in this document

Requirements for travellers not fully vaccinated with COVID-19 WHO EUL Vaccines:

- 1. Pre-Departure Test (PDT) within two days before departure, take any of the following COVID-19 tests:
 - COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction test; OR
 - Antigen Rapid Test (ART) administered by a trained professional, or self-administered ART that is remotely supervised by an approved ART provider in Singapore [for Singapore citizens, PRs and Long-Term Pass Holders (including In-Principle Approval holders) only]

The Pre-Departure Test (PDT) report, which shows a negative test result, must be in English (or accompanied by a notarised English Translation), and clearly states the traveller's name, date of test, as well as the traveller's date of birth or passport number per the passport used to travel to Singapore.

A PDT is not required only if you tested positive for COVID-19 between 14 to 90 days before your date of departure for Singapore. You can use this tool (http://go.gov.sg/recovered-traveller-checker) to check if the pre-departure test can be waived, and the documentation required to prove your first infection or recovery.

2. COVID-19 Travel Insurance

Short-term visitors must ensure they have travel insurance covering COVID-19, with at least \$30,000 of medical coverage. Read the COVID-19 insurance and medical treatment page for details: https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart/entering-singapore/COVID-insurance.

Accommodation:

There are many hotels in Singapore and the meeting venue is situated in a relatively accessible location from all parts of the island. We recommend accommodations near the city for ease of transportation throughout your stay, in particular on the MRT Circle line (orange line) that is near the Kent Ridge Station (CC24).

Time zone:

Singapore is GMT/UTC+8.

Weather:

Singapore is hot and humid all year-round, with temperatures usually reaching over 30°C. You should be prepared for rain at any time, which can be torrential but usually brief.

Currency:

The Singapore dollar come in denominations of S\$2, S\$5, S\$10, S\$50, S\$100, S\$1,000 and S\$10,000. Coins come in 5, 10, 20 and 50 cents and S\$1.

Power plugs:

The standard electrical current used in Singapore is 220-240 volts AC (50 cycles) and you can use power plugs with three square prongs (**Plug Type G**).
