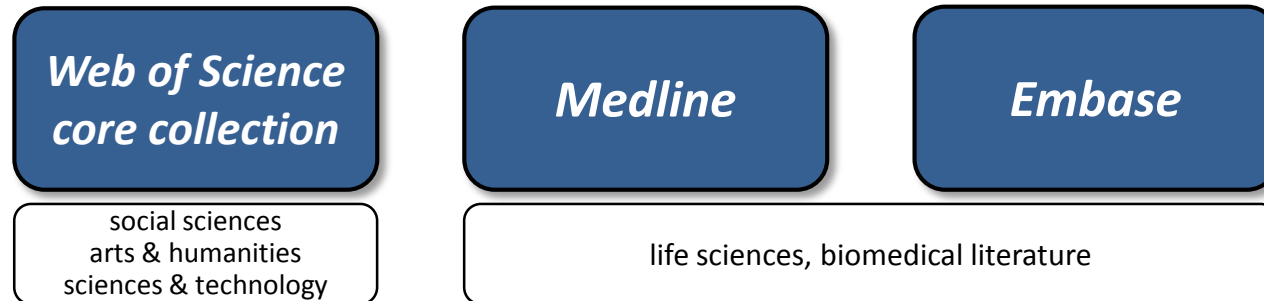
Research Purpose

- **Existing studies are...**
 - engineering-based or focus on technical issues and solutions
 - lacking systematic examination of e-Health studied by social scientists
- ***Divided standards landscape* in research**
- **Research purpose**
 - to identify and synthesize dispersed e-Health standards studies
 - to discover *the role and effect of standards in e-Health*



Research Method

- *Systematic review*
- **Database**



- **Inclusion and exclusion criteria**
 - standards-related topic
 - “standards” not in a broader meaning

Developed countries

- **North America**

 - Canada C-HOBIC project

 - U.K. NHS Data Accreditation Programme
 - EC eStandards project

- adoption, harmonization of standards
- information exchange across networks

Developing countries

- **Africa**
 - the Millennium Villages Project (MVP)
 - Kenya standards and guidelines for EMR systems
- **China**
- **Saudi Arabia**

- centered on the development and adoption of standards

- **Data and device standards**

Effects of standards

- **Interoperability**
 - simplifying, speeding up patient data exchange
- **Security and privacy**
- **Quality of care and hospital performance**

- Health data standards and medical device standards created by different modes of standardization help ensure interoperability, usability, quality, security and privacy

Adoption of standards

- **Factors that affect adoption decisions of standards**
- **Organizational context**
 - barriers
 - facilitators
 - critical factors

• Implementation approaches tailored for different standards are needed to translate them into practice

Application in technical frameworks development

- **Proposal of frameworks**
 - HL7 CDA Release 2
 - IEEE 11073
 - CEN 13606
 - HL7 and IHE profiles

• Standards used globally are implemented in developing new, interoperable frameworks
