- Proposal abstracts should be submitted in English as an MS file
- Proposal abstracts for the IFLA pre-conference must be submitted by **21 February 2014**, must be in English and should clearly include:
  - Title of proposed presentation
  - Abstract of proposed paper (no more than 300 words)
  - Name(s) of presenter(s) plus position and/or title
  - Employer / affiliated institution
  - o Contact information including e-mail address, telephone number
  - Short biographical statement of presenter(s)
  - Language of presentation
