



1995 1996 1997 1998 1999 2000 2001 2002 2003






Top 10 African economies by number of Internet Users, 2003

Africa's mobile market structure, by number of countries



#### A brighter outlook for Africa

- ICT market has doubled in size since 2000
  - More users added in the first few years of the new century than in the previous 100 years
- World's fastest growing mobile economy
  - Passing 50 million mobile users in 2003
- World's fastest growing regional Internet
  - Passing 12 million Internet users in 2003
- Competitive markets
  - > 75% of African economies have more than one mobile operator
- Effective, independent regulators
  - > Half of them established within last five years
