





Availability of Mobile broadband, 2010






Fixed Broadband Prices


¹ The ITU ICT Price Basket is a composite measure based on three tariff sets — fixed-telephone, mobile-cellular and fixed-broadband Internet services — and computed as a percentage of average GNI per capita. The ITU ICT Price Basket¹ shows that between 2008 and 2010 ICT services have become more affordable and relative prices came down by an average of 18%, globally.

Internet users per 100 inhabitants, 2001-2011*




Note About the IPB

ITU's ICT Price Basket (IPB) is a composite affordability measure based on three sub-baskets – fixed telephone, mobile cellular and fixed broadband Internet services – and computed as a percentage of average Gross National Income (GNI) per capita. As a comprehensive benchmarking tool, the IPB monitors the relative price of ICT services and provides an indication of how affordable services are across countries, and over time.





How are the wholesale tariffs of services regulated?




Wholesale Services - World, 2011

How are the wholesale tariffs of services regulated?




Wholesale Services - Americas, 2011


Type of cost on which cost models are based

America and Africa are mostly using current cost for retail services






Which concept is used as the basis for calculating telecommunication service tariffs?




