What is **Benchmarking**?

Benchmarking – using of the best practice, analytic comparison of tariffs in internal or similar markets or across countries



Why Tariff Benchmarking?

- Suitable both for retail and wholesale services
- Tariffs usually reflect level of costs of different services
- Could be used by regulators, policy makers and operators



Benefits of Tariff Benchmarking

- Affordable
- Non-complicated
- Easy to obtain information for comparison



Benchmarking Methodology

Analytic comparison could be based on:

- Simple average values of tariffs
- Simple average excluding excesses
- Weighted average (using PPP or other factor)
- Tariff baskets

Results of comparison could be applied in direct way as price cap on regulated tariffs or indirect way as tool for policy makers, regulators and operators



Available Data Sources

- Reports and publications of international institutions (ITU, EC, OESD, EUROSTAT...)
- Reports and publications of consultant firms
- Questionnaires distributed between NRAs, associations of regulators or operators
- Direct contacts with colleagues in other countries
- Internet resources



Disadvantages of Benchmarking/ Common mistakes

- Based on historical data
- Possible inaccuracy of data
- Comparison of non-comparable data
- Average values don't reflect real situation, i.e., social and political reasons
