- Supply-Side: Infrastructure, ISPs, ICT Industry etc.

- Household surveys
- Business surveys
- Government surveys

ICT Impact on Business, Government & Society

 e.g. impacts on productivity, how ICT can reduce poverty and in what ways



WSIS Outcome

- Appropriate indicators and benchmarking, including community connectivity indicators
