Subject: Invitation to the Preliminary Planning Meeting for the project on "Enhancing Competitiveness in the Caribbean Through the Harmonization of ICT Policies, Legislation and Regulatory Procedures (HIPCAR)", Grenada, 15-16 December 2008

Dear Sir/Madam.

The International Telecommunication Union (ITU), in collaboration with the Caribbean Telecommunications Union (CTU), is pleased to invite your organization to participate in the Planning Meeting to **launch the HIPCAR Project**, designed to enhance the contribution of ICTs to Caribbean competitiveness and socio-economic development. This project is part of a global ITU/EC project encompassing Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific Islands (ACP) supported and funded by the European Commission (EU)<sup>1</sup>. **The meeting will take place in Grenada on 15-16 December 2008.** 

Caribbean countries as a whole have moved to liberalize their telecommunications sectors, but different approaches have been used. While some commonalities exist, the policies, legislation and regulatory practices across the Caribbean reflect the different experiences and circumstances in the region. The HIPCAR project is intended to address these issues and assist Caribbean countries in adopting a more harmonized approach to ICT policy, legislation and regulation taking account of these experiences and of best practices in the region and around the world.

The project was conceived by ITU, the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Secretariat and the CTU in response to requests from CARICOM states and other ICT stakeholders who saw the need for a more unified approach to the subject. CARICOM countries are also parties to the Millennium Development Goals as well as to the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS), both of which support greater use of ICTs for economic and social development. In addition, CARICOM has recognized that ICTs have

a major role to play in the development and further integration of CARICOM states, especially in the context of the CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME). In this connection, CARICOM has established an ICT Task Force whose work will be closely linked to the activities carried out under the HIPCAR project.

The main objectives of the Preliminary Planning Meeting are:

- 1. To formally present the HIPCAR project to Caribbean stakeholders
- 2. To solicit inputs from ICT stakeholders regarding the main areas of regional focus and the priorities for the project
- 3. To identify relevant resources and technical cooperation requirements in the region
- 4. To define the project's scope of work, including deliverables at the regional and country levels
- 5. To determine mechanisms for stakeholders' participation
- 6. To propose the project plan of action and implementation scheme
- 7. To identify the Project Team and the key point of contact / liaison for each country.

It is expected that participants at the meeting will include senior stakeholders with decision-making authority on ICT development policy, legislation and / or regulation. Their contributions will be vital to clarifying and making more precise the scope, focus and modalities of implementation of the project.

ITU will provide a technical briefing paper well in advance of the meeting aimed at fostering a common understanding of the proposed areas to be covered by the HIPCAR Project. These include:

# **Registration and fellowships**

For those applying for a fellowship, registration and request for the fellowship must be made **no later than 23 November**.

A compilation of these contributions will be circulated electronically to all participants prior to the event as an input for the deliberations.
