At the kind invitation of **The Gambia Ministry for Communications, Information and Technologies**, the International Telecommunication Union - Development Bureau (ITU-D) is organizing a **West Africa Workshop on Spectrum Management** which will take place from **8-12 October 2007** inclusive, at **Paradise Beach Hotel, Banjul**, in the Gambia.

The workshop is being organized in collaboration with the Regulatory Body, Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (PURA).

Use of frequencies in every sphere of daily economic and social activity has increased in the past years and, as a scarce ressource, it must be well managed and monitored in order to allow the individuals, organizations, network and service providers to take advantage of it. Spectrum allocation licensing, monitoring and pricing are some of the major issues being considered at all levels. The coordination of spectrum allocation in the era of Convergence is a major broadband issue for global harmonized fixed-satellite service frequency bands.

This workshop is organised for the Western Africa Anglophone Countries and is targeted at policy makers / regulators / service providers / operators It aims at bringing together all stakeholder groups in the West-African countries to discuss, learn, share information and collaborate on frequency spectrum issues, in particular in:

- Spectrum Engineering Practices;
- Automation of Spectrum Management;
- Spectrum Monitoring;
- · Regional Coordination;
- Regulating Frequencies for NGN;
- Best practices of Frequency Pricing;
- Procurement of spectrum monitoring systems.

A draft program of the workshop is set out in Annex 1 hereto.

Participation is open to ITU Member States, Sector Members and Associates and to any individual from a country that is a member of ITU who wishes to contribute to the work.

The workshop is free of charge and limited fellowships will be granted to participants from LDCs.

The workshop will be conducted in English only. No interpretation will be provided.


