## **TRANSPORTATION**

Transportation will be available for delegates from the airport to their respective hotels, as well as from the hotels to the forum venue and back.

## **AIRPORT**

Lusaka International Airport is the international airport for Zambia. It is served by the major international airlines.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND VISA INFORMATION FOR ZAMBIA

A valid passport and an entry visa are required to enter Zambia. Visas must be obtained prior to arrival and are required by the nationals most countries with the exception of some Commonwealth & SADC countries. Delegates are advised to contact the Zambian Embassy of their country for confirmation. Visas can be obtained and issued in Zambia, especially for those wishing to stay beyond the meeting period.

For countries in which Zambia has no consulate or embassy, the host country may apply for a visa on your behalf and it would be issued to you upon arrival. The fee for a single-entry visa is USD50 to be paid at the point of entry.

Participants who wish the host country to apply for entry visas on their behalf should provide a copy of the biodata from their passport to

### GENERAL INFORMATION

## **INSURANCE**

Participants are advised to obtain supplementary medical/travel insurance. However, excellent private medical facilities in Zambia can provide for all of your medical needs. First aid services will be available at the meeting venue.

## **CLIMATE**

Zambia has a typically tropical climate with three distinct seasons. December to April – warm and wet. May to August – cool and dry. September to November - hot and dry. Average temperatures in Summer range from 25 degrees Celsius to 35 degrees Celsius and in Winter 6 degrees Celsius to 24 degrees Celsius.

## **TIME ZONE: GMT+2**

Zambia is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time., one hour ahead of Central European Time, seven hours ahead of Eastern USA Time and ten hours ahead of Western USA Time.

## **CURRENCY**

The official currency is the Zambian Kwacha

Current rates: Buying K5,680 --- Selling: K5,765 as at 24 February 2009

Please be advised that this rate fluctuates regularly and needs to be checked often.

Foreign currency can be exchanged at any Foreign Exchange Bureau. Banks are open weekdays from 08.15 hours to 14.30 hours Monday to Friday and every first Saturday and last Saturday of a month.

Government Offices: Open 09.00 to 17.00 Monday to Friday and close for lunch from 13.00 hours to 14.00 hours

Shops: Most of them generally open from 08.00 hours to 17.00 hours Monday to Friday and half day on Saturdays.

## **TELECOMMUNICATIONS**

Four reliable telecommunications networks are available in Zambia (one fixed and three mobile). The country code for Zambia is + 260. Wireless Internet connectivity will be available in the Conference room for delegates.

## **SECURITY AND SAFETY**

Zambians pride themselves in being very friendly and hospitable people. However safety arrangements will be made and normal precautions are advised.

## **ELECTRICITY**

Electricity is 240V AC at 50Hz. Stabilizers are required for sensitive devices, and adapters are required for appliances using more than 230V.
