Mr Harris joined the British Post Office in 1964 and held a number of appointments in telecommunications management at local and headquarters level. At university level he studied computers and central European affairs.

In 1984 he was a founder member of the newly privatised BT's Government Relations Department, closely involved in establishing the relationship with Oftel and the UK government on regulatory matters.

He had a leading role in the Commission's activities in relation to telecommunications in Greece.

Since 1993 he has been an employee of the Commission and has been working on international telecommunications policy in relation to the countries of Eastern and Central Europe and of the newly independent states. He has particular responsibility for the Baltic States, Poland, Slovakia, the Czech Republic and Hungary.
