## **Session:** 1.1: Opening Session – Welcome Address

Oleg Gaiduk graduated from the Taras Shevchenko Kyiv State University and the Popov Odessa National Communication Academy. He gained practical experience in the institutions of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, took the key positions in the Supreme Council of Ukraine, the Cabinet Ministry of Ukraine. From 1993 till 1996 Mr. Gaiduk was involved in developing and creating the governmental telecommunication information and analytical system for emergency cases. From 1996 to 2000 he held the post as a Deputy Ministry on emergency situations where he worked for Ministry as a chief and developer of information and analytical computer system for supporting to the decision-making in the period of emergency cases, as well mobile control and communication unit, telecommunication networks and systems. Besides, he took responsibility for solving "problem2000".

Since 2000 Mr. Gaiduk filled the post as Deputy General Director, and from 2001 till 2003 – General Director, Head of the Board in the Public Corporation "Ukrtelecom". Since 2003 and up-to 2004 he was dealing with elaboration of implementation project related to the terminal equipment for using in the cellular communication networks at "Ukrinfotechnology". Besides, during the above-mentioned years he was a Head in the International Economic Committee.

From April till November 2004 he held the position as Deputy Minister of Economics and European Integration of Ukraine where his involvement was associated with administering the work in the Informatization Department.

On November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2004, he resigned as a sign of protest against vote-riggings during the presidential elections in Ukraine.

On April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2005, the President of Ukraine Viktor Yuschenko appointed him the Head of National Commission for Communications Regulation.
