





AI HELPING HUMANS BUILD BETTER WORLDS

January 6, 2025, at CES(the Consumer Electronics Show) Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang launched Cosmos, a family of world foundation models, that can predict and generate physics-aware virtual environments. Using data, text, images, video and movement to generate and simulate virtual worlds that accurately models environments and physical interactions.



Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang: "We created Cosmos to democratize physical AI which will revolutionise the \$50 tn manufacturing and logistics industries. Everything that moves — from cars and trucks to factories and warehouses — will be robotic and embodied by AI". 1X, Agility Robotics and XPENG, and autonomous developers Uber, Waabi and Wayve are using Cosmos.




UN(Nov 2023): 2/3 of global population, 6 bn people will face water scarcity by 2050.



OCED(Nov 2023) "How much water does AI consume? The public deserves to know" article quote Cornell University findings(Oct 2023) that the global AI demand may be accountable for 4.2 -- 6.6 billion cubic meters of water withdrawal in 2027, which is more than the total annual water withdrawal of 4 – 6 Denmark.

Est. 4.2~6.6 Billion Cubic Meters




4~6x Annual Water Withdrawal of Denmark

CNBC(June 2024): The EU's \$2.1 million ASCEND study(11 partners including Orange, HP, Airbus) concluded after 16 months of studies that launching data centres into orbit is technically, economically and environmentally feasible. They aim to deploy 1,300 building blocks by 2050 to achieve 1 gigawatt(power one million home by one hour).



Global Gateway: EU reinforces partnership with Africa through "Africa-EU Space Partnership Programme"

At the EU Space Conference in Brussels, the European Commission announced the "Africa-EU Space Partnership Programme." This initiative, backed by a €100 million investment, forms a critical part of the EU's Global Gateway strategy to deepen space cooperation between the EU and Africa.

LSE(Nov 2023): African countries have been exploring the use of tokenisation to address national governments debt with positive results in Nigeria, Ghana, Kenya. In Nov 2023, World Bank, IMF, the Bank for International Settlements, Swiss National Banks are working together to use tokenisation to simplify the process of allocating development funds to emerging economies.




In 2022, Nigeria launched a pilot project to assess the use of tokenization for government bond issuance. The project demonstrated that tokenized government bonds could be traded more efficiently and at lower costs than traditional bonds. This was a significant step in exploring the potential of blockchain technology in debt management.

Ghana has partnered with a fintech company to launch a tokenized debt platform. The platform allows investors to buy and sell Ghana's government debt instruments in the form of digital tokens. It has been well-received by investors, with significant trading volumes recorded since its launch.

Kenya has announced plans to develop a tokenized debt platform. The platform will allow investors to trade Kenyan government debt instruments on a decentralised exchange. This initiative is part of Kenya's broader strategy to leverage digital technologies for economic growth.

Other African countries, including Senegal, Rwanda, and South Africa, are also considering launching tokenized debt platforms soon. These initiatives highlight the growing interest in leveraging blockchain technology for debt management in Africa.

Tokenization, an emerging technology, carries significant potential to overhaul African debt management practices. By amplifying efficiency, transparency, and global accessibility, tokenization can empower African governments to better manage their debt and champion sustainable economic growth.

LONDON, Nov 28 (Reuters) - Three of the world's cornerstone institutions - the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank and the Bank for International Settlements - are to work together for the first time to "tokenise" some of the financial instruments that underpin their global work, a BIS official said on Tuesday

The trio will also work with Switzerland's central bank which has been pioneering tokenisation, the process of turning conventional assets into uniquely coded "tokens" that can be used in faster new systems.



YOUTH POPULATION (MILLIONS)


