# Revised Core ICT Household Indicators

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#### Introduction

- One of the early achievements of the Partnership on Measuring ICT for Development was to facilitate the development of a global list of core ICT statistical indicators.
- The list was released at the end of 2005 and included indicators for ICT infrastructure, household ICT access and use, business use of ICT and the ICT producing sector.
- During 2008, the indicators were revised in a world-wide consultation process.



#### Introduction (continued)

- The revision's aim was to improve the relevance and international comparability of ICT statistics.
- · Changes to the indicators reflected
  - changing policy interests
  - collection experiences
  - changes in technologies.
- A set of indicators on ICT in education was added.
- This presentation will show the revised indicators on access to, and use of, ICT by households and individuals
  - and explain how they have changed since 2005.



#### Major changes to indicators - 2005 to 2008

- The distinction between basic and extended core indicators was removed
  - it was no longer considered useful.
- Two new mobile access categories were added to the Location of Internet use indicator
  - Any place via a mobile cellular telephone
  - Any place via other mobile access devices.
- The category 'Communicating' in the Internet activities indicator was split into
  - Sending or receiving e-mail
  - Telephoning over the Internet/VoIP
  - Posting information or instant messaging.



#### Major changes to indicators – 2005 to 2008

- One of the 'downloading activities' categories was split
  - Downloading movies, images, music, watching TV or video, or listening to radio or music
  - Downloading software.
- Internet access categories have been simplified
   and a Mobile broadband category added.
- The two infrequent Internet use categories in the Frequency indicator have been combined to form a new category
  - Less than once a week.

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#### Other changes to indicators

- Removal of 'other' and aggregated response categories
   they are inconsistently reported.
- Technical changes to definitions (radio, television, computer, Internet, mobile telephone, Internet access services)
  - these are not expected to affect statistical time series.
- Clarification and minor changes to explanatory notes on the core indicators.
- Stronger instructions where there is known poor data comparability, for example
  - the 'response item' questions should allow multiple responses
  - Internet access/use is not only by computer.



#### Changes to associated statistical standards

- · The concept of the unit 'household' was clarified.
- Change to lower age scope cut-off for surveys
   from 16 to 15 years.
- Recognition of age groups for children (either 5-14 years or 10-14 years)
  - and individuals aged over 74.
- Changes to (and additional) advice on
  - deriving and aggregating the core indicators
  - reporting core indicators data to international organizations.
