During the Busan Plenipotentiary Conference in 2014, the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the Republic of Korea signed a cooperation agreement to assist developing countries in the Caribbean region, with the goal of establishing national spectrum management master plans. We are pleased to announce that this is the first ITU Project in the Americas Region, funded by the Republic of Korea.
