Subject: Girls in ICT Day Celebrations 26 April 2018

Dear Sir/Madam,

International Girls in ICT Day is an initiative backed by ITU Member States in Plenipotentiary Resolution 70 (Rev. Busan, 2014) to create a global environment that empowers and encourages girls and young women to consider studies and careers in the growing field of information and communication technologies (ICTs). Resolution 70 calls for all ITU members to celebrate and commemorate International Girls in ICT Day on the fourth Thursday of April every year. To date, over 300,000 girls and young women have been involved in more than 9,000 celebrations in 166 countries worldwide offering them the opportunity to experience personally the potential of ICTs and to learn more about the opportunities this sector can offer.

Even in the face of the global youth employment crisis, there will be tens of millions of jobs in the coming years for young women and men equipped with sought-after digital skills. Despite these opportunities recent research and data highlight how women continue to be underrepresented in the ICT sector. Considering the pervasive presence of ICTs in our everyday life, the growing need for digital skills in nearly all professional careers and the increasing and often unmet demand for ICT professionals worldwide, it is essential to increase our efforts to make sure women and men are equally represented in ICT studies and careers.

For this reason I would like to encourage all ITU Members to become part of this global campaign by organizing Girls in ICT Day events this year on 26 April 2018 to introduce girls and young women to ICT career opportunities, involve them in hands-on ICT creation workshops, and directly contribute to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal Targets 4.4, 5.b and 8.6.
