Background:

Since 2019, the Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) has been carrying out a series of consultative sessions with International Telecommunication Union (ITU)'s Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D) Members with the aim of increasing participation in the work of the Sector.

To strengthen engagement and build strong relations between the ITU-D Membership and ITU affiliated Academia and Research Institutes, the Director of BDT has decided to launch the **Know Your Members** Series, by holding one on one sessions with each of ITU-D's Member community (see communities in annex). The sessions will be informal, two-way, and provide an opportunity for an exchange of information and strengthening relations with the Membership.

Objective:

The **Know Your Members** Series was conceptualised to provide personalized and targeted opportunities for Membership to share views openly and freely with the BDT Director on their participation in the work of the ITU-D Sector and make suggestions, as necessary.

- ✓ Provide the Director of BDT with an opportunity to update Academia Members on ongoing and future work, and partnership opportunities.
- ✓ Gather her suggestions on how to strengthen participation in ITU-D work which could include Study Groups, Telecommunication Development Advisory Group (TDAG), and the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) preparations.
- ✓ Get to know partners at a more personal level and the specificity of their community and address their needs.
- ✓ Use this platform to ensure retention of current members and encourage them in the recruitment of new members.

Session Format:

This first Know your Members session will focus on Academia and Research Institutes affiliated to the ITU. It will be held virtually (English only) on **15 April 2021, from 13h00-14h00 CET**. The session will run as follows:

- Academia and Research Institutions updates on ongoing initiatives and expression of interests on the ongoing and planned BDT work.
- Open conversation on how to strengthen collaboration.
