We are pleased to invite your organization to participate in the "2025 ITU – ITTLLDC Seminar: Cooperation for Sustainable Space Connectivity, spectrum use, and Early Warning Systems" to be held from 28 to 29 August 2025 in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. This event is organized jointly by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the International Think Tank for Landlocked Developing Countries (ITTLLDC) and is supported by the Ministry of Digital Development, Innovation and Communications (MDDIC) and Communications Regulatory Commission of Mongolia.

The event will support the objective to achieve sustainable development and more effective integration of new and upcoming technologies in digital economy of the Landlocked Developing Countries in Asia and the Pacific and in the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS)'s region. It will build on the outcomes of last year' seminar (2024 event) and will focus on:

- Promoting international cooperation in the use of space, satellite and non-terrestrial digital connectivity solutions;
- Cross border RF interference mitigation;
- Leveraging digital networks for Early Warning dissemination.

The seminar is being planned as a physical event and will attempt to bring together participants and domain experts from Asia-Pacific and CIS regions with specific focus on Landlocked Developing Countries (LLDCs). Please note that this event will be held in English language, in paperless format. All relevant documents, such as the draft agenda (Annex 1), registration form, and practical information for participants, can be accessed on the ITU event website at <a href="http://itu.int/go/LLDC2025">http://itu.int/go/LLDC2025</a>.

#### **Fellowships**

To encourage participation of <u>eligible countries</u> with priority to LLDCs from CIS and Asia and the Pacific regions, one full fellowship may be granted per eligible Member State, subject to the availability of funds. Applications from Low Income Developing countries and Least Developed Countries (LDCs) from South and Southeast Asia may also be considered based on eligibility of funds. Full fellowships will cover the cost of air

ticket (one return economy class ticket by the most direct/economical route from the country of origin to the meeting venue), and appropriate daily subsistence allowance intended to cover accommodation, meals and incidental expenses.

Member States are encouraged to select their candidates taking into consideration the inclusion of persons with disabilities and persons with specific needs, bearing in mind gender balance. The duly validated fellowship request form (Annex 2) and its annexes, if any, must be returned to the Fellowships Service by e-mail to <a href="mailto:fellowships@itu.int">fellowships@itu.int</a> or by fax: + 41 22 730 57 78, by <a href="mailto:fellowships@itu.int">30 June 2025</a> at the latest. Registration prior to submitting the fellowship request is mandatory.

Please note that the "2025 Regional Cyberdrill for Asia and the Pacific Region" will also be held in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, from 2-5 September 2025. A separate invitation letter will be shared for this event. We encourage participants to also consider joining this event. Consideration may be given to extend fellowships to participate in both events, should participants fit the eligibility criteria to participate.

- Member States wishing to apply for an ITU fellowship **must not have any type of debt** related to the contributions derived from their contributory unit, except those who have agreed to a repayment plan and are in compliance with their obligations.
- **Highest-ranking officials** (Head of State, Head of Government, Minister, Vice-Minister, Secretary of State or equivalent, high-ranking diplomats) shall <u>not</u> be considered for fellowships.
