Terms of reference

- 1. To act as a single platform for focused discussions on future ITU-D study Questions, and to assist ITU membership in their preparations for the next WTDC by proposing specific changes to Resolution 2 (Rev. Kigali, 2022) on the scope of ITU-D study Questions, their number, titles, and terms of reference, taking into consideration the evolution of ICTs, priorities of ITU membership, as well as current and past activities/outcomes of ITU-D study groups.
- 2. To align, as far as possible, the proposed study Questions to BDT thematic priorities, proposed regional initiatives, the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals and WSIS Action Lines (C2, C5 and C6) for which ITU has lead responsibility.
- 3. To research and acquire views of ITU membership through relevant channels including surveys, contributions and meetings.
- 4. To liaise with ITU-D Study Groups through the appointed ITU-D Study Groups 1 and 2 coordinators for the future of study Questions. The coordinators may, inter alia, upon the request of the ITU membership, assist them to prepare contributions on Future of Questions.
- 5. To submit regular updates to TDAG.

Online consultation highlights in 1 slide - 48 responses

Current Questions

- Important: Q1/1 Broadband (93.8%) then Q3/2 Cybersecurity (85.4%) then Q5/1 Rural & remote telco (81.3%)
- Not Important: Q4/2 C&I, Counterfeit & mobile theft (20.8%) then Q2/1 Broadcasting & Q7/2 EMF (14.6%)

Future Structure

- 2 Study Groups (63%) next is 3 Study Groups (23%)
- 10 study Questions (35%) next is 14 Questions (25%)

Discontinuing

- Questions studied over several periods: Q2/1 (27%) then Q4/2 & Q7/2 (23%)
- Lack of interest: Q4/2 (23%) then Q2/1 (21%)
- Do not address directly ITU strategic goals: Q6/1, Q4/2 & Q6/2 (10%)

Merging

- Q1/1 Broadband & Q5/1 Rural & Remote telecoms (62.5%)
- Q1/2 Smart cities & Q2/2 E-services & applications (58.3%)
- Q3/1 Disaster risk reduction & Q6/2 Environment (56.3%)
- Q6/2 Environment & Q7/2 EMF (54.2%)

- Artificial Intelligence then new approaches to Regulation Cross Cutting Topics
- Economic Aspects
- Digital Skills (also high as stand alone topic)

Proposed first draft document

Revisions in tracked changes of an extract of Resolution 2 (Rev. Kigali, 2022) and on ToRs sections 1 & 2 of each Study Question in WTDC-22 Action plan (https://www.itu.int/dms_pub/itu-d/opb/tdc/D-TDC-WTDC-2022-PDF-E.pdf)

- 10 study Questions proposed
- Q1/1 Broadband & Q5/1 Rural & remote telecoms (62.5%) merged into a new Question A/1
- Q1/2 Smart cities & Q2/2 E-services & applications (58.3%) merged into a new Question A/2
- Q4/2 Counterfeiting & mobile theft parts merged with Question 6/1 Consumer protection into a new Question B/1
- Q6/2 Environment, Q7/2 EMF (54.2%) and Q4/2 Conformance & interoperability part merged into a new Question B/2
- Q3/1 Disaster risk reduction moved to SG2 and is now Q2/2
- Preliminary inputs proposed by SG1 (presented at December 2024 e-meeting) have been added where possible and the detailed revisions to ToRs of Q5/1 have been integrated in the new Question A/1
- Discussions held at December 2024 e-meeting have been considered
- Revisions of ToRs for current Questions of SG1 and SG2 are awaited (as contributions to next emeeting) and will be included.



Future steps

At the meeting of 4th March 2025

- Each focal point from regional groups (ATU, CITEL, APT, LAS, RCC, CEPT) will be invited to present a contribution from his/her region
- The update from TDAG WG on ITU-D Priorities will be presented as a contribution
- Discuss all contributions received to reach a final consolidated document which shares information to assist
 - ITU membership in their preparations for the next WTDC by proposing specific changes to Resolution 2 (Rev. Kigali, 2022) on the scope of ITU-D study Questions, their number, titles, and terms of reference, taking into consideration the evolution of ICTs, priorities of ITU membership, as well as current and past activities/outcomes of ITU-D study groups
