- Developed Guidelines (based on recommendations) on different aspects of C&I.
- Conducted national assessments.
- Organized a large number of workshops and events on C&I (limited by available human resources and funding)
- Explored the possibility of creating testing labs. Even explored the idea of a virtual test lab.
- Developed draft MRA.

to continue providing on-the-job capacity-building activities, in collaboration with recognized institutions and benefiting from the ITU Academy ecosystem, including activities related to preventing radiocommunication interference caused or received by ICT equipment.



Addressed problem

- Efficient running of C&I Programmes requires well educated professionals;
- Today there are no formal holistic C&I education programmes;
- Licensee and conformity managers must also have a clear understanding of legal and economic issues;
- Large institutions train staff on C&I by seconding them to experienced workers, but this offers narrowed vision and no formal quality check. At the same time, this is not possible in smaller institutions.



- CITP is following previous successful ITU training programmes, such as Regional Trainings on C&I Programmes and test domains
- Training materials based on ITU Publications on C&I, such as Guidelines and Recommendations
- Offers access to C&I training and forward-looking professional vision
- CITP follows **ITU Academy** quality assurance mechanism:
 - It is a full set of high-level materials prepared by high caliber subject-matter experts
 - Designed for anyone either a beginner or a specialist
 - Provides provision of certain level of knowledge
 - Provides possibility for different certification options
