Vijay Mauree joined the ITU, in 2010 and has over 20 years of experience in project management and cybersecurity. He is the focal point for Digital Financial Services at the Standardization Bureau in ITU. He is currently leading the DFS Security Lab at ITU which provides guidance on securing the digital financial services infrastructure and mobile payment applications used in emerging economies. He leads the Payments Working Group under GovtStack and is involved in coordinating the implementation of the Payments building specification using digital public goods. Vijay coordinates the secretariat for the Digital Currency Global Initiative which is a collaboration between ITU and Stanford Digital Currency Program. The Digital Currency Global Initiative is investigating areas where technical standards for Central Bank Digital Currency, Stablecoins, eMoney and cryptocurrency are required. He led the work related to security for digital financial services under the Financial Inclusion Global Initiative which was a partnership between the ITU, World Bank, Bank for International Settlements and the Gates Foundation. He coordinated the work of the ITU-T Focus Group Digital Financial Services and ITU-T Focus Group Digital Currency including Digital Fiat Currency. Vijay received his first degree in Computer Science with Electronic Engineering from University College London, UK and obtained his Masters degree in Information Technology from Imperial College, Science and Technology, UK. He also holds an MBA from Cranfield School of Management in UK.
