Cristina Volpin is a Competition Policy Expert at the OECD in Paris, where she is in charge of the work of the Competition Division on sustainability and on labour markets. **She is currently on loan to the European Commission, working in the Antitrust Unit dealing with IT, Internet and electronics at DG COMP.** Cristina authored various other research studies, including with a focus on competition enforcement and policy in the circular economy, innovation, and the economic recovery. She also regularly provides capacity-building to competition authorities and judges. She previously worked as a lawyer in two top-tier Italian law firms (Gianni Origoni Grippo Cappelli & Partners, and Chiomenti) and was an associate lecturer in competition law at Queen Mary University of London. Cristina obtained a Ph.D. in EU Competition Law from the University of Padua and completed a postgraduate course on Business Sustainability Management from the University of Cambridge. She was editor of the Journal of European Competition Law & Practice and she is currently a Fellow at the Centre for Law, Economics and Society at University College London as well as at George Washington University.
