

## Dr. Cristina Volpin

Cristina Volpin is a Competition Policy Expert at the OECD in Paris, where she in charge of the work of the Competition Division on sustainability and on labour markets. She is currently on loan to the European Commission, working in the Antitrust Unit dealing with IT, Internet and electronics at DG COMP. Cristina authored various other research studies, including with a focus on competition enforcement and policy in the circular economy, innovation, and the economic recovery. She also regularly provides capacity-building to competition authorities and judges. She previously worked as a lawyer in two top-tier Italian law firms (Gianni Origoni Grippo Cappelli & Partners, and Chiomenti) and was an associate lecturer in competition law at Queen Mary University of London. Cristina obtained a Ph.D. in EU Competition Law from the University of Padua and completed a postgraduate course on Business Sustainability Management from the University of Cambridge. She was editor of the Journal of European Competition Law & Practice and she is currently a Fellow at the Centre for Law, Economics and Society at University College London as well as at George Washington University.
