Subject: Biennial Seminar of the Radiocommunication Bureau (Geneva, 30 October - 3 November 2006)

1 You may recall that the Radiocommunication Bureau organizes on a biennial basis, at the ITU Headquarters in Geneva, a seminar which deals with the use of the radio-frequency spectrum and the Satellite Orbits, and, in particular, with the application of the provisions of the ITU Radio Regulations.

2 The Bureau is pleased to announce that the next seminar will be held at the ITU Headquarters in Geneva from 30 October to 3 November 2006.

As may be noted from the enclosed programme (<u>Annex 1</u>), the 2006 seminar will cover the international frequency management aspects of the terrestrial and space services, including related work of the ITU-R study groups. Special attention will be given to the decisions of the Regional Radiocommunication Conference for planning of digital terrestrial broadcasting in parts of Regions 1 and 3, in the bands 174-230 MHz and 470-862 MHz (RRC-06) and to the preparation for WRC-07. Demonstrations and workshops will enable the participants to get hands-on experience with ITU notification procedures as well as with some of the software and electronic publications made available by the Radiocommunication Bureau to the Administrations of Member States and to Radiocommunication Sector Members.

4 Based on the successful evaluation of the experiences from the last biennial seminar, in 2004, the same arrangements will be followed for the 2006 seminar, which means that lectures and workshops will be held in different rooms, enabling participants to prepare their own schedule, based on their interest, alternating between space and terrestrial services and lectures or workshops.

5 The lectures and discussions during the seminar will be held in the six working languages of the ITU (Arabic, Chinese, French, English, Russian and Spanish) with simultaneous interpretation facilities. The workshops will be held in separate groups in accordance with the language requirements and available facilities. A CD-ROM containing the relevant documentation will be distributed at the opening of the seminar. The documentation will be posted on the ITU-R website (<u>http://www.itu.int/ITU-R/conferences/seminars/</u>) and will also be made available after the seminar upon request, for training purposes within administrations.

6 The Administrations of Member States and Radiocommunication Sector Members are invited to attend the seminar. Notification of the anticipated participation should be communicated by means of the attached form (<u>Annex 2</u>), preferably by **30 September 2006**.

Given the amount of the expected practical work during the workshops, participants are invited to bring their laptop PC.

7 The cost of travel and accommodation in Geneva for participants is the responsibility of the administration/organization concerned. A number of hotels in Geneva and the surrounding area have agreed to offer preferential rates to delegates participating in ITU conferences and meetings. Information on the list of these hotels, as well as on the procedure to follow for the reservation of hotels, is available from the ITU website (see http://www.itu.int/travel/index.html). Bookings must be made by delegates in their own name, without going through a travel agent or airline company. Bookings should be sent by post or fax <u>directly to the hotel</u> using the form attached as <u>Annex 3</u>.

8 In recognition of the difficulty faced by the low income countries, the ITU will offer fellowships per country, with priority given to requests from the Least Developed Countries (LDCs). Fellowship requests should be submitted before **30 September 2006** using the form attached as <u>Annex 4</u>. Accommodation will be arranged and paid by the ITU.

9 We would remind you that citizens of some countries are required to obtain a visa in order to enter and spend any time in Switzerland. The visa must be requested and obtained from the office (embassy or consulate) representing Switzerland in your country or, if there is no such office in your country, from the one that is closest to the country of departure. If problems are encountered, the Union can, at the official request of the administration or company you represent, approach the competent Swiss authorities in order to facilitate delivery of the visa. Any such request must specify the name and functions of the individual(s) for whom the visa(s) is/are requested and be accompanied by a copy of the approved registration form approved for the ITU conference or meeting in question.

10 Attendance to the seminar is free of charge for ITU Member States and ITU-R Sector Members. However, in keeping with ITU Council decisions on ITU seminars, a fee of CHF 1 000 will be charged to non-members. This fee should be settled at the time of registration.

11 The seminar will commence at 0930 hours on 30 October 2006 and registration will be possible as of 0830 hours. Detailed information concerning the meeting rooms will be displayed on screens at the entrances to ITU headquarters.

12 The seminar will be held in conjunction with the ITU **Workshop on Market Mechanisms for Spectrum Management**, to be held from 2 to 3 November 2006. More information about the workshop can be found at: <u>http://www.itu.int/osg/spu/stn/spectrum/</u>.
