Subject: **Draft Rule of Procedure concerning RR No. 5.458**

At its 81st meeting (15 – 19 July 2019), the Radio Regulations Board agreed on the need to develop a rule of procedure on No. **5.458** to clarify that there is no frequency allocation to the Earth exploration-satellite (passive) and space research (passive) services in the frequency bands 6 425-7 075 MHz and 7 075-7 250 MHz. This draft rule of procedure is contained in Annex 1.

In accordance with No. **13.17** of the Radio Regulations, the draft Rules of Procedure are made available to administrations for comments before being submitted to the RRB pursuant to No. **13.14**. As indicated in No. **13.12A d)** of the Radio Regulations, any comments that you may wish to submit should reach the Bureau not later than **16 September 2019**, in order to be considered at the 82nd meeting of the RRB, scheduled for 14 – 18 October 2019. ARTICLE 5 of the RR

ADD

5.458

There is no allocation to the Earth exploration-satellite (passive) and space research (passive) services in the frequency bands 6 425-7 075 MHz and 7 075-7 250 MHz. Notification of frequency assignments to Earth exploration-satellite (passive) and space research (passive) services in the band 6 425-7 075 MHz and 7 075-7 250 MHz will be considered by the Bureau not to be in conformity with the Table of Frequency Allocations.

***Reasons:** to clarify that there is no frequency allocation to the Earth exploration-satellite (passive) and space research (passive) services in the bands 6 425-7 075 MHz and 7 075-7 250 MHz and that such use will not be in conformity with the Table of Frequency Allocations. Similar clarification can be found in the Rule of Procedure of No. 5.149 for radio astronomy in certain frequency bands.*
