Al 8 — Review of Country footnotes



- WRC-12 resolves ... 8) to consider and take appropriate action on requests from administrations to delete their country footnotes or to have their country name deleted from footnotes, if no longer required, taking into account Resolution 26 (Rev.WRC-07);
- See provisions in Sections I to III of RR Article 5
- Res. 26 (Rev. WRC-07) includes principles and conditions of consideration of additions, i.e. only when:
- a) the WRC agenda explicitly includes the frequency band to which the proposed ADD or MOD relates; or
- b) the frequency bands to which the desired ADD or MOD belong are considered during the WRC and it decides to make a change in those bands; or
- c) ADD or MOD is specifically included in the agenda of the WRC as a result of the consideration of proposals submitted by one or more interested ADM(s)

Note: AI 8 is not in the scope of the CPM

Issue 9.1.4



Resolution 67 (WRC-12): Updating and rearrangement of the Radio Regulations

In accordance with Resolution 67 (WRC-12), ITU-R carried out studies during the current study period and considered the issue of possible updating, review and revision of outdated information, and rearrangement of certain parts of the Radio Regulations (RR), except for Articles 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22, 23 and 59 and those parts which are being revised on a regular basis.



Issue 9.1.4₍₂₎



- On the basis of input contributions and documents for the meetings of the ITU-R responsible group, the following issues were developed:
 - Issue A: Modification to RR Article 2, and
 - Issue B: Modification to the titles of some RR
 Articles for the purpose of better reflecting in the title the scope of these articles.
- For Issue A, two draft options are proposed: A1:keep unchanged RR Article 2
 A2:MOD RR No. 2.1 to delete the unused metric abbreviations for the bands in this provision.
- For Issue B, two draft options are proposed: B1: keep unchanged the RR B2: MOD the title of RR Articles 37, 39, 40, 42, 43, 44, 47, 49, 50, 52 and 53







Resolution 957 (WRC-12): Studies towards review of the definitions of fixed service, fixed station and mobile station

- >ITU-R carried out studies to
 - carefully review the definitions of fixed service, fixed station and mobile station,
 - assess the potential impact on regulatory procedures in the Radio regulations (RR) (coordination, notification and recording) and the impact on current frequency assignments and other services resulting from possible changes to the definitions.
- The Concerned Groups were consulted and their responses taken into account.



Issue 9.1.6₍₂₎



In conclusion, ITU-R developed one draft regulatory and procedural consideration:

SUP Res. 957 (WRC-12)

- Considering that retaining the current definitions in RR Article 1 is able to adapt to technology evolution and that there is sufficient flexibility within the present RR.
- Furthermore, it was concluded that there was no need to develop a new ITU-R Report under this issue.



Issue 9.1.7



Resolution 647 (Rev.WRC-12): Spectrum management guidelines for emergency and disaster relief radiocommunication

- >ITU-R carried out studies to carefully review this issue
- Concerned Groups were consulted and their responses taken into account
- > 3 draft options were identified in the regulatory and procedural considerations under this issue
- Furthermore, it was concluded that there was no need to develop a new ITU-R deliverable under this issue.



Issue 9.1.7₍₂₎



The regulatory and procedural considerations include three draft options, as follows:

A: MOD Res. 647 (Rev.WRC-12) and consequential SUP of Res. 644 (Rev.WRC-12)

B: MOD Res. 647 (Rev.WRC-12) only

C: SUP Res. 647 (Rev.WRC-12) and consequential MOD of Res. 644 (Rev.WRC-12)



Al 10 – Next WRC Agenda



- **WRC-12** *resolves* ... 10) to recommend to the Council items for inclusion in the agenda for the next WRC, and to give its views on the preliminary agenda for the subsequent conference and on possible agenda items for future conferences, in accordance with Article 7 of the Convention,
- > Preliminary agenda items in Res. 808 (WRC-12)
- 2.1 to consider regulatory actions, including spectrum allocations, to support GMDSS modernization and implementation of enavigation in accordance with Resolution **359** (WRC-12); 2.2 to consider the appropriate regulatory procedures for notifying satellite networks needed to facilitate the deployment and operation of nanosatellites and picosatellites, in accordance with Resolution **757** (WRC-12);
- ➤ Principles for establishing WRC agendas in Res. 804 (Rev. WRC-12) includes also a Template for the submission of proposals for agenda items
- ➤ Contributions on AI 10 to CPM15-2 will be included in an Annex to the CPM Report for information only (Res. ITU-R 2-6)
