

The general configuration for WRC-23







About APMs

- 1. Meets annually >> usually in Q3.
- **2. Decision making** >> *on WRC issues and other matters*
- 3. Chaired by host country >> hence ATU not having a permanent chair for the cycle
- 4. Managed by a bureau >> All 5 Sub-Regions representation ensured
- 5. Input documents only submitted by Members (Member States and Associate Members)
- 6. Main basis for decisions are the WG recommendations
- 7. Most recent being APM23-3 held in Lusaka (Zambia) >> whose report can be accessed here
- 8. Next will be APM23-4 to be held in ECCAS Sub-Region >> rotates among the Sub-Regions



About WGs

- 1. Established by the 1st APM for a given cycle and expire after a given WRC is completed
- 2. As for WRC-23, there are 7 such Working Groups >> can be accessed here
- 3. Has Chair, and 1 or more Vice-Chairs and Al Lead Champions >> Sub-Regional balance
- 4. Different from ATU-R Task Groups
- 5. Mainly convenes to develop recommendations for an APM >> but may meet as required
- 6. Non-decision making >> may only develop recommendations or draft proposals unless otherwise
- 7. Managed by a bureau >> All 5 Sub-Regions representation ensured
- 8. Input documents only submitted by Members (Member States and Associate Members)
- 9. Next WGs meetings will be after CPM23-2



Rule for adoption of AfCPs



The general rule for adoption of African Common Position (AfCP) is **15 countries for** and **no more than 8 against.**



The burden is placed on those against a proposal/position to expressly state their opposition.

The proponent countries need not be 15.
