## BR International Frequency Information Circular (BR IFIC) Terrestrial Services 2026



The BR International Frequency Information Circular (BR IFIC) Terrestrial Services is a consolidated regulatory publication issued once every two weeks by the Radiocommunication Bureau, pursuant to the Radio Regulations (Nos. **20.1** to **20.6** and No. **20.15**) and various regional agreements. It contains information on the frequency assignments/allotments submitted by administrations to the Radiocommunication Bureau for recording in the Master International Frequency Register and in the various regional or worldwide Plans. The information published corresponds to the recorded assignments/allotments as well as the notifications in process. The BR IFIC (terrestrial services) may be consulted directly online (<https://www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrasys/>) or from an ISO file (<https://www.itu.int/pub/R-SP-LN.IT-2026>). The BR IFIC contains the query software TerRaQ, the program TerRaNotices for creation and validation of electronic notices and the Preface in PDF format.

The BR IFIC (Space Services) is published at the same time.

Member State administrations benefit from free access to the BR IFIC Online and the BR IFIC ISO files, accessible with TIES account.

Users who are not from Member State administrations shall designate a user for each subscription.

## PRICES

The prices quoted in the ITU Catalogue of Publications, as well as in Publication Notices (distributed free of charge and visible on the ITU website at the following address: [www.itu.int/publications](http://www.itu.int/publications)), are in Swiss francs (CHF) and are subject to change without notice.

Discounts of 15 per cent are granted to ITU Member State Administrations, Sector Members and Associates. A non-cumulative discount of 80 per cent on all Publications is granted to Member State Administrations of Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Academia Members, while a non-cumulative discount of 80 per cent is also granted to libraries of educational institutions with respect to Subscription Services and CD-ROM/DVD-ROM Publications only.

Catalogue prices of electronic publications (on CD-ROM, DVD-ROM, USB key and online) are given for single users. For corporations and institutions, multi-user licences are granted taking into account the number of authorized users. Please refer to the corresponding Publication Notices on the web. Please note that the minimum price for a publication bought from the Electronic Bookshop is twenty Swiss francs (CHF 20.–).

## FORMS OF DISPATCH

The catalogue price includes the cost of dispatch by non-registered economy-class mail or the means of carriage most advantageous to ITU. Dispatch can be requested in other forms: i.e. airmail, DHL, Federal Express, TNT, or diplomatic pouch. If one of these alternative methods is chosen, the dispatch cost will be added to the quote. Clients may choose to provide the ITU with their own valid Fedex/DHL/TNT account number for shipping at his expense. If a freight forwarder is designated by the client, this client assumes all transport charges. The costs of shipping via registered mail have been added to the economy-class costs. Customer may refuse these conditions but, in this case, ITU will not be held responsible for the replacement of any undelivered orders dispatched by mail that has not been registered. Customs duties and other taxes or dues levied on imported goods are not borne by ITU. ITU accepts no responsibility for delay, loss or damage in shipment. ## Maritime Manual 2024



The Manual for Use by the Maritime Mobile and Maritime Mobile-Satellite Services (Maritime Manual) is a reference document that provides a complete description of maritime communications. The 2024 edition reflects the recently adopted decisions of the World Radiocommunication Conference, 2023 (WRC-23) concerning the above services, and the most recent updates related to the currently used maritime radio systems showing their latest developments. Volume 1 provides the description of the organization and operation of the GMDSS and other maritime operational procedures. Volume 2 provides a compilation of the relevant ITU regulatory, technical and operational texts that are related to the maritime mobile and maritime mobile-satellite services. As prescribed in Appendix 16 to the Radio Regulations, the Maritime Manual is required to be carried by stations on board ships. This publication is also a useful reference resource for the wider maritime community, including educational institutions, GMDSS training centres, search and rescue (SAR) services, communication service providers and shipping companies.
