# **International activities**

Mr Emirali has participated in ITU radiocommunications conferences and radiocommunications assemblies for the last 15 years. As such he has an in-depth knowledge of the ITU procedures, the Radio Regulations, and the international spectrum management framework.

He has led NZ delegations to a number of international military frequency management meetings and forums. He has been chairman of the five nation (AUS, CAN, NZL, USA, UK) military Combined Communications-Electronics Board Frequency Panel for three separate periods (1990, 1995 and 2000).

As senior communications specialist in the RNZAF mobile communications unit Mr Emirali participated in many humanitarian operations throughout the Pacific region.

## National activities

Chairman (2nd term) of the NZ industry Major Spectrum Users Advisory Group (an industry/commercial group that provides advice to the national spectrum authority and NZ Government on industry use of the radio spectrum).

Past Chair (3 times) and current member of the NZ Public Safety Radio Frequency Management Group; charged with overseeing the provision and management of spectrum for Public Safety agencies and Emergency services in NZ.

Board member NZ Telecommunications Educations Skills Standards Training Organisation -Responsible for development of qualifications and training standards for telecommunications in NZ.

Chairman and active participant of various NZ preparatory groups for WARCs and WRCs 1987-2002.

Military representative on NZ radiocommunications sector activities.

Military representative on the telecommunications planning team for the Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting and the more recent Asia Pacific Economic Community (APEC) meeting, NZ, 2000.

#### Summary

Mr Emirali has had over 34 years experience in radiocommunications. The last 16 years have been specifically in the field of spectrum management. In New Zealand he has been selected to chair various national groups concerned with spectrum utilization and the development of procedures for use of the spectrum on a coordinated basis. He has had significant experience in the ITU radiocommunications sector over many years and has participated in numerous ITU radiocommunications conferences (WARC and WRC).
