REGION OF BUENOS AIRES

It is the cultural, political and financial center of Argentina, in the immensity of the wet Pampas.

The City of Buenos Aires, La Plata, Bahía Blanca, Campana, Mar del Plata, Miramar, Necochea, Pilar, Pinamar, Tigre and Villa Gesell are part of this Region. REGION OF CORDOBA


At the heart of the country, this is one of the main economic centers of Argentina. It combines valleys, high plains, valleys and streams. The capital of the province, Córdoba, is a cosmopolitan city, a prominent cultural and services center within the country, part of an area known for its natural settings, reservoirs and first class tourist infrastructure.

The city of Villa Carlos Paz, an hour far from Córdoba city, offers a range of beautiful landscapes, together with a varied cultural and recreational billboard, endless nightlife, and first class services.

This province keeps much of the colonial legacy of the Jesuit Order missionaries in estancias, convents, churches, among others.

• JESUIT BLOCK & ESTANCIAS

Take a tour around the XVIIth and XVIIIth centuries at the Jesuit Block & Estancias circuit, UNESCO World Heritage of Humanity: Caroya, Jesús María, Santa Catalina, Alta Gracia and La Candelaria, revisiting the Spanish colonial times, and the days of the Jesuit religious Order working on these lands with native peoples.

• A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME

Extraordinary paleontological remains and ancient landscapes. Sierra de las Quijadas and Valle de la Luna are the ideal locations for outdoor activities. Here the stones are a living testimony of the work of wind, water, sun and temperature changes, protecting one of the most important paleontological sites in the world. It is a unique opportunity to see the remains of vertebrates that inhabited the place in the Mesozoic Era, 180 million years ago, together with dinosaur footprints and ferns, and petrified Araucaria trunks imprints.

• THE STONE SENTINEL

Discover the majestic experience of climbing Cerro Aconcagua, the highest in The Americas, with its 6,962 meters (2.2841 ft.). Visited by mountain climbers from all around the world, the impressive Aconcagua offers different options for experts and beginners.

• SNOW TIME

Carry out your next ski competition under the imposing Andes. There are multiple options in Valle de Las Leñas or Los Penitentes ski resort: skiing, snowboarding and challenges in the Snowpark.



•INCA TRACES

Walk into The Andes on mule or horseback, following old trails used hundreds of years ago by native people, then by the Spanish colonists, and later by the army commanded by Capitán José de San Martin during the independence battles from the Spanish Crown. Reach the high snowcapped mountain passes, discover marine fossil areas, appreciate Cerro Aconcagua, glaciers, frozen rivers and "ice penitents".

REGION OF LITORAL

Exuberant nature in the cities of Resistencia, Corrientes, Concordia, Paraná, Formosa, Posadas, Puerto Iguazú, Santa Fe de la Vera Cruz and Rosario. This region is very attractive because of its stunning flora and fauna. Waterfalls, rivers, streams and hot springs are some of the options to enjoy before, during or after your event.

• IGUAZU FALLS TO THE EXTREME

Sail upstream to the base of the nearly 300 waterfalls up to 80 meters (263 feet) high, surrounded by the most amazing subtropical forest of Iguazú National Park. This is one of the New 7 Natural Wonders of the World and UNESCO World Heritage Site. Enjoy the opportunity to practice canopy or wet rappelling in front of the falls.



• HEALTH, RELAXATION AND NATURE

Relax in the many Thermal Parks of the region, with modern facilities and unique scenery in the tranquility of a natural environment. The chemical composition of these hot springs gives it a distinguishing feature for its excellent therapeutic properties of strong mineralization and high salt content, to which a well-head temperature of 41 $^{\circ}$ C (105 $^{\circ}$ F) is added.

• LIVE ESTEROS DEL IBERÁ

Take a boat ride through Esteros del Iberá, one of the richest wetlands in biodiversity in the world, ideal destination for adventure, fishing, wildlife watching and unique expeditions.



RAINFOREST SAFARI

Get into a pristine virgin subtropical rainforest rich in biodiversity, in 4x4 vehicles with Iguazú National Park guides.

• EXPLORATION & SURVIVAL

A thrilling ride deep into the islands of Río Paraná, the second largest basin of South America, practicing outdoor adventure sports, fishing, outdoor cooking and camping.

• BY THE RIVER

Organize your next water competition in the widest nautical track in South America, Río Paraná. With eleven water feet depth, and the possibility of sailing throughout the year, Río Parana has a Delta of approximately 17,500 km2 (4,324,344 acres), providing a fascinating range of options for all types of skills such as "Maratón Internacional Hernandarias - Paraná", sailing 88 km (54 miles) along the river.



• JOY AND COLOR IN THE CARNIVAL

Join the colorful parades with variety of designs, embroideries and allegorical floats to the rythm of the music in the famous carnivals in the Proviences of Corrientes, Chaco and Entre Ríos.

• FEEL THE POWER

Tour the facilities of the Hydroelectric Power Station "Yacyretá" responsible for generating 22% of the energy consumed in Argentina. With 20 turbines on Paraná River, this mega engineering work can be also visited from the water in different boats.

NORTH REGION

Land of traditions in the cities of La Rioja, Salta, San Fernando del Valle de Catamarca, San Miguel de Tucumán, San Salvador de Jujuy, Santiago del Estero and Las Termas de Río Hondo. This region stands out for its natural landscapes combining valleys, mountains, streams, salt dessert and hot springs, combined with the charm of its ancient past reflected in its traditions, its culture and the warmth of its people.

• A TRIP TO THE CLOUDS

A unique experience onboard the 3rd highest train in the world, leaving from Salta capital city and crossing Puna region along The Andes. Sorting out tunnels, bridges, zig-zags and amazing curves, this fantastic piece of engineering reaches 4,200 meters (13,800 feet) above sea level and offers one of the most amazing trips.



OFFERINGS TO PACHAMAMA

Join a millennial celebration, heritage of the native communities that inhabited this region, performed to thank and bless "Mother Earth", followed by musical, religious and culinary activities, among others.



• FOLK CLUBS

Learn some steps of Argentine folklore dance to the rhythm of guitars, bombos and the clapping of native dancers and the audience.

• THE "SEISMILES"

Take a 4x4 drive along the over 6,000 meters (19,700 feet) high mountain chain with 19 volcanoes, through gorges, height lagoons, salt flats and Fiambalá hot springs. These hills were the scenery of long pilgrimages and special ceremonies of the Andean cultures, and today, a challenge for mountaineers and scientists around the world.

• STUNNING TALAMPAYA

Discover this striking red desert cliff, where fossils and rock art shaped by the action of nature over 250 million years ago were found.



REGIONAL COOKING CLASSES

The most delicious dishes and flavors with the perfect combination of the talents of renowned chefs and the magical Inca culture legacy. Cooking workshops for visitors to learn the best and most traditional recipes that are still enjoyed in Argentina.

HIGH ALTITUDE WINES

Tour the wine cellars where the main grapevine is Torrontés. In a mountainous valley - 3,000 meters (10,000 feet) above sea level- the most prominent High Altitude Wines of international recognition are produced. It is also possible to visit the Grapevine and Wine Museum in the town of Cafayate.

REGION OF PATAGONIA

There are magic landscapes in the cities of Comodoro Rivadavia, Puerto Madryn, Trelew, Santa Rosa, Neuquén, San Martín de los Andes, Villa La Angostura, Viedma, San Carlos de Bariloche, El Calafate, Río Grande and Ushuaia. It is a dreamlike region with incredible landscapes in both winter and summer. Mountains, glaciers, national parks, forests, lakes, beaches, cliffs, and rich flora and fauna are the ingredients for an unforgettable stay.

MINITREKKING ON THE GLACIER

A magnificent experience in Los Glaciares National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. About 350 glaciers to discover and walk, ending the tour with a memorable toast of "whiskey on the rocks" with glacier ice, facing the imposing Lago Argentino.



ROAD TO ANTARCTICA

This unique experience sailing on a luxury expedition cruise ship leaves from the port of the southernmost city of the world, Ushuaia, heading to the White Continent. Birds, whales, sea lions and dolphins surrounded by mountains, icebergs and countless glaciers are some of the attractions to enjoy.
