## Subject: Invitation to provide inputs to the 1st public consultation on the ITU strategy for 2020-2023

The 2017 Session of the ITU Council initiated the process for the elaboration of the draft Strategic plan for the Union for 2020-2023, by establishing the Council Working Group for Strategic and Financial plans for 2020-2023 (CWG-SFP, <u>www.itu.int/en/council/cwg-sfp-2020-2023/</u>). The group held its inaugural meeting on 23 May 2017, at the ITU Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland, and decided to hold a first public and open consultation on the strategic priorities of the Union.

- 2. What are the key technological trends ITU should consider while planning its strategy?
- 3. What do you consider to be the top three challenges for the ITU and the top three achievements you would like to see the ITU accomplish in the 2020-2023 timeframe?
- 4. Any other thoughts or comments you would like to make?
