## Subject: 2019 Session of the Council

Dear Councillor,

In accordance with Rule 1 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council, I have the pleasure to remind you that the 2019 session of the Council will be held at ITU headquarters from **Monday**, **10 June 2019 (0930 hours) to Thursday**, **20 June 2019**.

An informal briefing with Councillors will take place on Sunday 9 June from 1630 to 1730 hours.

## Preliminary draft agenda

A preliminary draft agenda of the 2019 ordinary session is attached in Annex. A draft time management plan is under preparation and will be sent to you in due course.

As per Council rule of procedure 4.3, Member States of the Union shall communicate to the Secretary-General at least 8 weeks before the opening of the Session (before15 April 2019), any further item they would like to propose.

### Registration

Registration for the 2019 ordinary session of the Council will begin on **11 March 2019**. It will be carried out **exclusively online** at the Council website (<u>www.itu.int/en/council/2019</u>).

In line with ITU gender equality and mainstreaming policy, I would also like to take this opportunity to encourage you to include women in your delegation. As part of my commitments to the <u>International Gender</u> <u>Champions</u>, ITU reports on the representation of women in all ITU meetings.

Council identity badges can be collected at ITU Headquarters in Geneva (Montbrillant Building, main entrance), on **Monday 10 June 2019**, from 0830 hours onwards.

#### Documentation

In accordance with Annex 2 to Decision 5 (Rev. Dubai, 2018), paragraph 8, and in order to reduce cost of documentation, Council documents will be made available <u>exclusively online</u> at <u>www.itu.int/en/council/2019</u>. No paper copies of documents will be distributed before or during the 2019 Session of Council.

Similar to the previous Sessions of Council, an ITU C19 Sync Application will facilitate the download of C19 documents from the ITU server to your local drive. This application will be available on the Council website and is configured to synchronize the latest published documents. If you wish to be notified by e-mail when new or updated Council documents are posted, kindly update your TIES access at <a href="http://www.itu.int/TIES/">http://www.itu.int/TIES/</a>.

Contributions to Council should be submitted as soon as possible to <u>contributions@itu.int</u>. In accordance with Council Decision 556, all contributions should be submitted <u>no later than 14 calendar days</u> before the opening of the meeting, i.e. **27 May 2019.** ITU secretariat documents calling for a decision of the Council will be posted on the relevant page of the website no later than 30 calendar days before the opening of the Council session.

As per <u>ITU information/document access policy</u>, Council input documents will be publicly accessible, unless otherwise requested by the submitter(s) of the document.

In accordance with Council Decision 495, should a Member State of the Council consider that an information document needs to be considered by the Council for further action, the said Member State of Council should express its wish to have the information document translated in all six official languages, no later than five (5) calendar days after its publication on the Council website.

#### Travel, subsistence and insurance expenses

In accordance with No. 57 of the Convention of the ITU, "the travelling, subsistence and insurance expenses incurred by the representative of each Member State of the Council belonging to the category of developing countries, the list of which is established by the UNDP, in that capacity at Council sessions, shall be borne by the Union".
