WHAT DO WE WANT TO DO?

Identify and disseminate means through which children (under 18) are using the Internet 'to be safer', by helping prevent, protect and respond to violence, for themselves or for their peers. This includes, using online channels to contact helplines, access protection resources, creating peer-to-peer support systems and networks, and coming up with innovative solutions for reporting different forms of violence.



Phase 1







MAP

- Helplines and organizations providing direct support to children via online means around protection and wellbeing, including those connecting with children through social media channels.
- Existing peer networks providing support to children and young people around prevention, protection, and response to violence, including mental health.

DISSEMINATE

Make the information widely available for children, organizations, Member States, and agencies everywhere, through a digital map online, outlining existing referrals, helplines and support systems in a child friendly manner.

LEARN

Identify good practices and commonalities between these services, to better understand how children are using online means to be safer, contributing to child protection systems.

RECOMMEND

Consolidate finding and lessons learned, with recommendations for improving and expanding services providing direct support to children.
