Subject: **Invitation to the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC-21)**

Dear Sir/Madam,

Further to my circular letter CL-22/006, I have the honour to inform you that, following the kind invitation of the Government of Rwanda and the approval by Council with the concurrence of a majority of the Member States of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), the forthcoming World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC-21) will be convened in **Kigali, Rwanda, from 6 to 16 June 2022**.

In accordance with Article 25 of the ITU Convention and Section 3 of the General Rules of conferences, assemblies and meetings of the Union, I therefore have great pleasure in hereby inviting your organization/agency to participate in WTDC as an observer.

World Telecommunication Development Conferences (WTDCs) are convened in the period between two Plenipotentiary Conferences to consider topics, projects and programmes relevant to telecommunication development. WTDCs set the strategies and objectives for the development of telecommunication/ICT, providing direction and guidance to the ITU Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D).

The next WTDC comes at a defining moment for the world and our place in it. The COVID-19 global pandemic has brought home the stark reality that in today's hyper-connected economies, connectivity is not just important, it is critical. As it is increasingly clear that digital solutions will be instrumental to the success of this final Decade of Action in achieving the SDGs, our joint efforts will be more decisive than ever. In recognition of the central role of ICTs, and as decided by TDAG at its meeting on 23 November 2020, the theme selected for WTDC is **"Connecting the unconnected to achieve sustainable development"**.

WTDC will be preceded by the Generation Connect Global Youth Summit, which will also be convened in Kigali, Rwanda, from 2 to 4 June 2022. The Summit, the first of its kind, is an exciting opportunity to foster sustainable innovation and digital inclusion which will provide youth representatives from across the world

with the opportunity to build new digital skills, debate and network with global decision makers of the ICT sector. The outputs of the Youth Summit will serve as important inputs to the global policymaking WTDC. In order to make this opportunity a reality, UN organizations/agencies and other regional organizations are invited to include youth amongst their participants to the Conference.

WTDC will also feature the Partner2Connect Digital Development Roundtables, scheduled to take place on 7-9 June 2022. This event, to be held within the WTDC, will offer Member States, ITU-D Sector Members and other stakeholders an opportunity to engage in high level discussions around the challenges and opportunities related to digital development, make concrete pledges and forge new partnerships. The event will afford opportunities for high-level participants to the conference including Ministers, Chief Executives and other leaders in the ICT development sector, to offer their commitments and pledges to ICT development.

Further details on the Generation Connect Global Youth Summit, or the Partner2Connect Digital Development Roundtable, including how to participate, will be published on the [WTDC-21 website](#).

I further refer to Resolution 55 (Rev. Buenos Aires, 2017) of the World Telecommunication Development Conference, on Mainstreaming a gender perspective for an inclusive and egalitarian information society, and in line with this, encourage you to include women experts in your delegation in addition to supporting their active involvement in ITU-D activities. The Network of Women established in ITU-D provides the platform for the engagement and empowerment of women, within the year and at the WTDC itself.

The draft agenda of WTDC-21 is also attached to this letter, for your easy reference. This agenda was endorsed by the Telecommunication Development Advisory Group (TDAG) at its 8-12 November 2021 meeting and is being submitted to the 2022 session of Council and afterwards to all Member States, for approval.

The draft structure of WTDC-21, along with the practical arrangements will be sent to you in due course. Rest assured that whatever COVID-19 measures are relevant at the time of the Conference will be strictly applied.
