Further to my <u>invitation letter</u> to attend the forthcoming 2022 Session of the Council at ITU headquarters from **Monday, 21 March (0930 hours) to Thursday, 31 March 2022**, I am pleased to share with you some updated information on organizational matters.

## Updated draft agenda and draft time management plan

An updated draft agenda of the 2022 ordinary session has been published on the Council website as  $\underline{C22/1}$ , as well as a draft time management plan ( $\underline{C22/DT/2}$  and  $\underline{C22/DT/3}$ ).

## Registration

Registration for the 2022 ordinary session of the Council is open. It is carried out **exclusively online** at the following webpage: <a href="https://www.itu.int/en/council/Pages/Registration.aspx">https://www.itu.int/en/council/Pages/Registration.aspx</a>.

In line with ITU gender equality and mainstreaming policy, I would also like to take this opportunity to encourage you to include women in your delegation. As part of my commitments to the <u>International Gender Champions</u>, ITU <u>reports on the representation of women in all ITU meetings</u>.

Participants from the Permanent Missions in Geneva are reminded that they will not be able to use their UNOG accredited pass, and a separate ITU event badge is required, and therefore registration with an ITU user account is necessary.

Council identity badges can be collected at ITU headquarters in Geneva (Montbrillant Building, main entrance), on Friday, 18 March, 09.00-12.00 and 14.30-17.00, and on Sunday, 20 March, 08.30-12.00 and 13.00-17.00. As of Monday, 21 March from 08.30-12.00 and 13.00-17.00 (please verify the opening times on the registration webpage).

I would like to remind you that in accordance with Council Decision 556, all contributions from Member States should be submitted <u>no later than 14 calendar days</u> before the opening of the meeting, i.e. **6 March 2022** to ensure timely translation and their thorough consideration during the 2022 session of the Council.
